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The butter in storage amounts to 13,086,636 pounds of creamery and 202,093 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows an increase of 58.98% over last year and a decrease of 3.86% from last month and dairy butter also shows an increase of 100.82% over last year and a decrease of 20.88% from last month.

Cheese stocks total 8,859,420 pounds in storage showing decreases of 38.31% and 14.10% from last year and last month respectively.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 70,787 dozen; other than cold storage 302,504 dozen; and frozen eggs 1,794,688 pounds. Cold storage eggs show decreases of 61.15% from last year and 56.00% from last month; eggs, other than in cold storage show increases of 42.62% over last year and 99.36% over last month; and frozen eggs show decreases of 17.42% and 19.10% from last year and last month respectively.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 14,713,757 pounds; fresh, not frozen 2,974,415 pounds; cured, dry salted 1,272,280 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 7,059,776 pounds; in process of cure 7,975,551 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 30.81% from last year and an increase of 9.58% over last month; fresh stocks, not frozen show decrease of 27.26% from last year and 21.93% from last month; cured, dry salted stocks show decreases of 10.74% from last year and 1.70% from last month; cured sweet pickled stocks show a decrease of 21.62% from last year and an increase of 10.12% over last month; and stocks in process of cure show increases of 150% over last year and 13.34% over last month.

The lard in storage amounts to 2,661,233 pounds showing decreases of 37.97% and 7.62% from last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 11,017,576 pounds of fresh frozen; 4,704,213 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 276,149 pounds of cured and 250,261 pounds of stocks in process of cure. Frozen stocks show an increase of 10.43% over last year and a decrease of 23.34% from last month; stocks not frozen show decreases of 1.96% from last year and 11.07% from last month; cured stocks show a decrease of 3.22% from last year and an increase of 7.46% over last month; and stocks in process of cure show an increase of 6.07% over last year and a decrease of 14.20% from last month.


The veal in cold storage amounts to 1,580,577 pounds of fresh frozen and 292,360 pounds of fresh not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 81.50% over last year and a decrease of 31.70% from last month; and stocks not frozen show increases of 44.86% and 9.92% over last year and last month respectively.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 4,962,406 pounds of frozen and 340,540 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 23.05% over last year and a decrease of 30.05% from last month; while stocks not frozen also show an increase of 237.48% over last year and a decrease of 42.78% from last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 539,354 pounds; chickens 3,515,390 pounds; fowl 1,447,058 pounds; ducks 177,902 pounds; geese 154,639 pounds; turkeys 1,275,352 pounds; unclassified 2,700,209 pounds. Total poultry shows an increase of 29.24% over last year and a decrease of 7.33% from last month.

Fish stocks total 18,728,791 pounds of fresh frozen and 6,252,903 pounds of other fish in cold storage. Fresh frozen fish shows increases of 28.18% over last year and 5.41% over last month; and other fish in cold storage also shows increases of 32.46% and 4.32% over last year and last month respectively.

During the month of February 3,807,208 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 2,164,718 pounds frozen during January.




