COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, May 1, 1930.

The butter in storage amounts to 8,245,048 pounds of creamery and 192,929 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows an increase of 221.79% over last year and a decrease of 32.81% from last month; and dairy butter also shows an increase of 239.81% over last year and a decrease of 15.09% from last month.

Cheese stocks total 6,395,908 pounds showing a decrease of 44.60% from last year and an increase of .85% over last month.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 4,988,093 dozen, 698,739 dozen; and frozen eggs 1,947,459 pounds. Cold storage eggs show a decrease of 6.15% from last year and an increase of 478.83% over last month; eggs other than cold storage show a decrease of 7.44% from last year and an increase of 7.75% over last month; and frozen eggs also show a decrease of 14.13% from last year and an increase of 4.80% over last month.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 14,874,166 pounds; fresh not frozen 3,511,023 pounds; cured dry salted 1,513,049 pounds; cured sweet pickled 6,631,800 pounds; in process of cure 7,956,882 pounds. Fresh frozen pork shows decreases of 35.17% from last year and 10.00% from last month; fresh not frozen stocks show increases of 11.03% over last year and 22.72% over last month; cured dry salted shows a decrease of 31.03% from last year and an increase of 37.42% over last month; cured sweet pickled shows decreases of 12.36% from last year and 7.61% from last month; and stocks in process of cure show decreases of 24.70% from last year and 7.08% from last month.

The lard in storage amounts to 2,458,161 pounds showing decreases of 51.52% and 6.87% from last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 9,199,482 pounds of fresh frozen; 3,286,057 pounds of fresh not frozen; 158,050 pounds of cured; and 176,315 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 25.98% over last year and a decrease of 17.01% from last month; fresh not frozen show decreases of 6.35% from last year and 13.43% from last month; cured stocks show decreases of 63.10% from last year and 28.51% from last month; and stocks in process of cure show an increase of 2.65% over last year and a decrease of 12.33% from last month.

The veal in cold storage amounts to 1,568,772 pounds of fresh frozen and 578,407 pounds of fresh not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 111.65% over last year and 22.63% over last month; and fresh stocks not frozen also show increases of 21.85% and 64.45% over last year and last month respectively.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 4,727,111 pounds of frozen and 252,078 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 84.70% over last year and a decrease of 16.90% from last month; while stocks not frozen show a decrease of 39.03% from last year and an increase of 57.12% over last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows: broilers 279,082 pounds; chickens 3,036,560 pounds; fowl 1,233,485 pounds; ducks 150,913 pounds; geese 107,377 pounds; turkeys 946,972 pounds; unclassified 1,805,863 pounds. Total poultry shows an increase of 53.53% over last year and a decrease of 12.06% from last month.

Fish stocks total 16,723,933 pounds of fresh frozen and 6,316,997 pounds of other fish in cold storage. Fresh frozen fish shows an increase of 23.29% over last year and a decrease of 6.60% from last month; and other fish in cold storage show increases of 52.53% and .58% over last year and last month respectively.

During the month of April 2,529,599 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 2,620,136 pounds frozen during March.
