COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS. APRIL 1, 1931.

The butter in cold storage amounts to 6,579,636 pounds of creamery and 202,495 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows decreases of 46.39% from last year and 41.83% from last month and dairy butter also shows decreases of 12.24% and 28.04% from last year and last month respectively.

Cheese stocks total 11,792,927 pounds showing an increase of 85.71% over last year and a decrease of 10.71% from last month.

Cold storage eggs amount to 1,879,376 dozen; fresh eggs 844,916 dozen; and frozen eggs 3,272,895 pounds. Cold storage eggs show increases of 117.93% over last year and 56.59% over last month; fresh eggs show increases of 28.89% over last year and 52.04% over last month; and frozen eggs also show increases of 61.16% and 13.43% over last year and last month respectively.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 7,400,607 pounds; fresh not frozen 2,880,417 pounds; cured dry salted 1,037,542 pounds; cured sweet pickled 6,139,457 pounds; in process of cure 5,477,574 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 52.35% from last year and 7.52% from last month; fresh not frozen stocks show an increase of .61% over last year and a decrease of 10.28% from last month; cured dry salted stocks show a decrease of 5.79% from last year and an increase of 22.10% over last month; cured sweet pickled stocks show decreases of 14.47% from last year and 10.15% from last month; and stocks in process of cure also show decreases of 36.09% and 8.57% from last year and last month respectively.

The pure lard in storage amounts to 3,165,446 pounds showing an increase of 19.81% over last year and a decrease of 2.62% from last month.

Beef stocks total 4,645,810 pounds of fresh frozen; 3,782,844 pounds of fresh not frozen; 264,991 pounds of cured; and 145,674 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 58.15% from last year and 7.43% from last month; fresh stocks not frozen also show decreases of .50% from last year and 5.63% from last month; cured stocks show an increase of 19.81% over last year and a decrease of 16.11% from last month; and stocks in process of cure show decreases of 28.06% and .54% from last year and last month respectively.


The veal in cold storage amounts to 599,756 pounds of fresh frozen and 290,481 pounds of fresh not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 53.12% from last year and 24.64% from last month; and fresh not frozen stocks show a decrease of 17.41% from last year and an increase of 8.40% over last month.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 2,872,478 pounds of frozen and 270,837 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show decreases of 49.79% from last year and 32.91% from last month; while stocks not frozen show increases of 74.72% over last year and 48.26% over last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 140,871 pounds; chickens 2,228,411 pounds; fowl 815,628 pounds; ducks 82,101 pounds; geese 40,412 pounds; turkeys 657,067 pounds; unclassified 958,600 pounds. Total poultry shows decreases of 42.85% and 22.75% from last year and last month respectively.

Fish stocks total 18,360,680 pounds of fresh frozen and 5,701,834 pounds of smoked and other varieties. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 2.52% over last year and a decrease of 17.32% from last month; and smoked and other varieties show a decrease of 12.59% from last year and an increase of 11.65% over last month.

During the month of March, 531,886 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 3,161,806 pounds frozen during February.




