COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, MARCH 1, 1932.

The butter in cold storage amounts to 10,212,050 pounds of creamery and 144,037 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows decreases of 9.67% from last year and 45.33% from last month; and dairy butter also shows decreases of 49.25% from last year and 27.01% from last month.

Cheese stocks total 7,936,046 pounds in storage showing decreases of 39.91% and 22.26% from last year and last month respectively.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 281,615 dozen; fresh eggs 250,559 dozen; and frozen eggs 3,251,711 pounds. Cold storage eggs show decreases of 76.54% from last year and 81.67% from last month; fresh eggs also show decreases of 54.80% from last year and 58.36% from last month; and frozen eggs show an increase of 10.33% over last year and a decrease of 12.70% from last month.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 20,209,900 pounds; fresh not frozen 3,371,464 pounds; cured, dry salted 572,699 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 7,858,917 pounds; in process of cure 8,423,117 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 152.16% over last year and 25.15% over last month; fresh not frozen stocks show an increase of 5.01% over last year and a decrease of 22.18% from last month; cured, dry salted stocks show a decrease of 32.59% from last year and an increase of 6.28% over last month; cured, sweet pickled stocks show increases of 15.08% over last year and 2.89% over last month; and stocks in process of cure also show increases of 40.60% over last year and 14.02% over last month.

The pure lard in storage amounts to 2,737,788 pounds showing decreases of 15.63% and 15.32% from last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 5,019,178 pounds of fresh frozen; 4,032,650 pounds of fresh not frozen; 313,538 pounds of cured; and 234,518 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of .07% from last year and 11.78% from last month; fresh stocks not frozen show an increase of .60% over last year and a decrease of 11.11% from last month; cured stocks show decreases of .74% from last year and 23.73% from last month; and stocks in process of cure show increases of 60.12% over last year and 145.33% over last month.


The veal in cold storage amounts to 452,899 pounds of fresh frozen and 240,993 pounds of fresh not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 42.94% from last year and 32.05% from last month; and fresh stocks not frozen also show decreases of 10.06% from last year nad 12.89% from last month.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 6,048,244 pounds of frozen and 181,872 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 40.72% over last year and a decrease of 13.80% from last month; and stocks not frozen show decreases of .44% from last year and 52.78% from last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 274,016 pounds; chickens 4,251,676 pounds; fowl 1,055,246 pounds; ducks 156,908 pounds; geese 234,393 pounds; turkeys 1,821,737 pounds; unclassified 3,873,788 pounds. Total poultry shows an increase of 83.05% over last year and a decrease of 11.72% from last month.

Fish stocks total 10,724,151 pounds of fresh frozen and 6,795,470 pounds of smoked and other varieties. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 49.09% from last year and 17.77% from last month; and smoked and other varieties show an increase of 29.92% over last year and a decrease of 20.15% from last month.


During the month of February 1,641,633 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 1,503,088 pounds frozen during January.






