COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, MARCH 1, 1932.

The butter in cold storage amounts to 4,433,273 pounds of creamery and 62,670 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows decreases of 32.65% from last year and 56.06% from last month; and dairy butter also shows decreases of 69.15% from last year and 56.48% from last month.

Cheese stocks total 7,660,504 pounds showing decreases of 35.04% and 3.45% from last year and last month respectively.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 245,955 dozen; fresh eggs 421,792 dozen; and frozen eggs 3,298,093 pounds. Cold storage eggs show decreases of 86.91% from last year and 12.32% from last month; fresh eggs show a decrease of 50.08% from last year and an increase of 68.30% over last month; and frozen eggs also show a decrease of 2.06% from last year and an increase of 1.43% over last month.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 21,861,803 pounds; fresh, not frozen 3,822,125 pounds; cured, dry salted 377,860 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 5,974,875 pounds; and in process of cure 8,214,384 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 194.78% over last year and 8.28% over last month; fresh stocks not frozen also show increases of 32.69% over last year and 14.80% over last month; cured, dry salted stocks show decreases of 63.61% from last year and 34.02% from last month; cured, sweet pickled stocks show decreases of 2.68% from last year and 23.85% from last month; and stocks in process of cure show increases of 49.96% over last year and a decrease of 2.48% from last month.

The pure lard in storage amounts to 2,844,743 pounds showing a decrease of 10.20% from last year and an increase of 5.21% over last month.

Beef stocks total 3,931,243 pounds of fresh frozen; 4,419,406 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 353,390 pounds of cured; and 209,956 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 15.45% from last year and 21.38% from last month; fresh stocks, not frozen show increases of 16.58% over last year and 13.41% over last month; cured stocks show increases of 33.36% over last year and 12.85% over last month; and stocks in process of cure show an increase of 44.13% over last year and a decrease of 10.47% from last month.

The veal in cold storage amounts to 366,833 pounds of fresh frozen and 639,023 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 33.88% from last year and 18.98% from last month; and fresh stocks not frozen show increases of 119.99% over last year and 173.44% over last month.


Mutton and lamb stocks total 4,846,397 pounds of frozen and 175,688 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 68.15% over last year and a decrease of 18.31% from last month; and stocks not frozen show a decrease of 35.13% from last year and an increase of .30% from last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 232,383 pounds; chickens 3,181,654 pounds; fowl 700,533 pounds; ducks 129,351 pounds; geese 184,064 pounds; turkeys 1,558,095 pounds; unclassified 3,472,275 pounds. Total poultry shows an increase of 91.85% over last year and a decrease of 18.78% from last month.

Fish stocks total 9,247,405 pounds of fresh frozen and 4,973,739 pounds of smoked and other varieties. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 49.71% from last year and 13.76% from last month; and smoked and other varieties also show decreases of 12.78% and 26.81% from last year and last month respectively.

During the month of March 1, 117,876 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 1,641,633 pounds frozen during February.

Fresh unfrozen fish in cold storage show a total of 64,666 pounds as compared with 83,525 pounds shown last month.


