COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, SEPTEMBER 1, 1932.

The butter in cold storage amounts to 30,943,115 pounds of creamery and 337,946 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows an increase of 20.28% over last month, and a decrease of 22.60% from last year; and dairy butter also shows an increase of 30.89% over last month and a decrease of 19.59% from last year.

Cheese stocks total 22,119,314 pounds showing an increase of 14.10% over last month and a decrease of 29.20% from last year.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 11,896,329 dozen; fresh eggs 994,728 dozen; and frozen eggs 5,023,089 pounds. Cold storage eggs show an increase of 5.15% over last month and a decrease of 17.27% from last year; fresh eggs also show an increase of 21.52% over last month and a decrease of 27.18% from last year; and frozen eggs show decreases of 3.37% and 13.54% from last month and last year respectively.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 10,254,722 pounds; fresh, not frozen 3,118,443 pounds; cured, dry salted 709,847 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 6,082,725 pounds; in process of cure 9,787,967 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 26.19% from last month and an increase of 108.50% over last year; fresh stocks not frozen show increases of 13.48% over last month and 11.65% over last year; cured, dry salted stocks show an increase of 81.97% over last month and a decrease of 3.55% from last year; cured, sweet pickled stocks show decreases of 5.02% from last month and 10.00% from last year; and stocks in process of cure show a decrease of 12.54% from last month and an increase of 86.63% over last year.

The pure lard in storage amounts to 2,707,176 pounds showing decreases of 24.80% and 15.66% from last month and last year respectively.

Beef stocks total 2,791,610 pounds of fresh frozen; 4,595,549 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 287,305 pounds of cured; and 177,150 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 4.36% over last month and 5.98% over last year; fresh stocks not frozen show an increase of 12.52% over last month and a decrease of 2.68% from last year; cured stocks show a decrease of 4.81% from last month and an increase of 49.94% over last year; and stocks in process of cure show a decrease of 20.97% from last month and an increase of 1.52% over last year.

The veal in storage amounts to 893,293 pounds of fresh frozen and 322,518 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 11.21% over last month and a decrease of 30.40% from last year and fresh stocks not frozen show a decrease of 21.79% from last month and an increase of 11.07% over last year.


Mutton and lamb stocks total 872,409 pounds of frozen and 366,367 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show a decrease of 12.76% from last month and an increase of 65.58% over last year, and stocks not frozen show increases of 32.07% and 37.99% over last month and last year respectively.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 136,648 pounds; chickens 1,093,268 pounds; fowl 332,399 pounds; ducks 154,593 pounds; geese 150,355 pounds; turkeys 836,027 pounds; unclassified 670,711 pounds. Total poultry shows a decrease of 23.62% from last month and an increase of 105.84% over last year.

Fish stocks total 16,734,372 pounds of fresh frozen and 6,227,825 pounds of smoked and other varieties. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 21.18% over last month and a decrease of 29.97% from last year, and smoked and other varieties show increases of 12.86% and 30.56% over last month and last year respectively.

Fresh, unfrozen fish in storage amounts to 82,548 pounds, as compared with 56,197 pounds shown last month.


During the month of August 3,985,820 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 6,073,241 pounds frozen during July.
