COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, JANUARY 1, 1933.

The butter in cold storage amounts to 20,328,081 pounds of creamery and 68,670 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows decreases of 15.86% from last year and 24.88% from last month and dairy butter also shows decreases of 69.52% and 37.19% from last year and last month respectively.

The cheese stocks total 12,943,678 pounds showing an increase of 10.81% over last year and a decrease of 2.29% from last month.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 1,253,999 dozen; fresh eggs 272,277 dozen; and frozen eggs 3,772,829 pounds. Cold storage eggs show decreases of 56.89% from last year and 69.60% from last month; fresh eggs show a decrease of 46.65% from last year and an increase of .31% over last month; and frozen eggs show decreases of 9.31% and 5.45% from last year and last month respectively.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 11,764,536 pounds; fresh not frozen 4,280,577 pounds; cured dry salted 460,545 pounds; sweet pickled 6,219,214 pounds; in process of cure 6,827,326 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 21.22% from last year and an increase of 76.95% over last month; fresh stocks not frozen show increases of 60.58% over last year and 11.78% over last month; cured dry salted stocks show increases of 3.93% over last year and 12.52% over last month; cured sweet pickled stocks show a decrease of 7.31% from last year and an increase of 26.62% over last month; and stocks in process of cure show an increase of 22.26% over last year and a decrease of 12.10% from last month.

The pure lard in storage amounts to 2,326,624 pounds and this includes prime steam lard also. Compared with last year's figures a decrease of 6.33% is shown while last month's figures show an increase of 51.21%.

Beef stocks total 5,113,253 pounds of fresh frozen; 3,420,795 pounds of fresh not frozen; 222,042 pounds of cured; and 183,544 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 17.43% from last year and an increase of 10.15% over last month; fresh stocks not frozen show decreases of 2.84% from last year and 29.47% from last month; cured stocks show increase of 20.22% over last year and 180.59% over last month; and stocks in process of cure also show increases of 8.12% and 96.70% over last year and last month respectively.

The veal in storage amounts to 701,574 pounds of fresh frozen and 179,933 pounds of fresh not frozen. Decreases in all comparisons are shown as follows:- fresh frozen decreasing 36.32% from last year and 21.53% from last month; and fresh not frozen stocks decreasing 23.95% from last year and 49.93% from last month.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 5,043,337 pounds of frozen and 247,200 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show a decrease of 40.72% from last year and an increase of 3.36% over last month, and stocks not frozen show an increase of 22.51% over last year and a decrease of 43.69% from last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 164,241 pounds; chickens 2,684,523 pounds; fowl 800,927 pounds; ducks 303,742 pounds; geese 150,435 pounds; turkeys 2,866,040 pounds; unclassified 1,370,831 pounds. Total poultry shows a decrease of 39.59% from last year and an increase of 134.73% over last month.

Fish stocks total 17,120,719 pounds of fresh frozen and 6,734,010 pounds of smoked and other varieties. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 10.55% over last year and a decrease of 15.45% from last month; and smoked & other varieties show decreases of 26.98% and 6.11% from last year and last month respectively.

Fresh unfrozen fish in storage amounts to 39,771 pounds as compared with 52,195 pounds shown last month.

During the month of December 1,680,478 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 2,740,434 pounds frozen during November.
