COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, DECEMBER 1, 1933.

The butter in cold storage amounts to 28,999,979 pounds of creamery and 330,196 pounds of dairy and of the creamery butter about 1,250,000 pounds are stored in creameries with mechanical refrigeration. Including the stocks in creameries added to the list March 1st, creamery butter shows an increase of 10.0% over last year and a decrease of 22.3% from last month; dairy butter also shows an increase of 202.0% over last year and a decrease of 18.1% from last month.

Cheese stocks total 16,611,862 pounds showing an increase of 25.6% over last year and a decrease of 39.4% from last month.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 4,199,345 dozen; fresh eggs 191,503 dozen; and frozen eggs 2,513,802 pounds. Cold storage eggs show an increase of 1.8% over last year and a decrease of 54.0% from last month; fresh eggs show decreases of 29.3% from last year and 39.4% from last month; and frozen eggs show decreases of 37.0% from last year and 10.4% from last month.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 5,607,080 pounds; fresh not frozen 4,256,568 pounds; cured dry salted 990,416 pounds; cured sweet pickled 4,228,793 pounds; in process of cure 9,426,889 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 15.7% from last year and an increase of 39.5% over last month; fresh stocks not frozen show increases of 11.1% over last year and 67.0% over last month; cured dry salted stocks show increases of 142.0% over last year and 1.3% over last month; cured sweet pickled stocks show a decrease of 13.9% from last year and an increase of 5.5% over last month, and stocks in process of cure show increases of 21.4% over last year and 11.2% over last month.

The lard in storage amounts to 1,604,470 pounds showing an increase of 4.3% over last year and a decrease of 17.4% from last month.

Beef stocks total 12,036,626 pounds of fresh frozen; 5,624,914 pounds of fresh not frozen; 113,573 pounds of cured; and 194,359 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 159.3% over last year and 40.2% over last month; fresh not frozen stocks show increases of 16.0% over last year and 2.8% over last month; cured stocks show an increase of 43.5% over last year and a decrease of 47.1% from last month; and stocks in process of cure show increases of 108.3% over last year and 41.7% over last month.

The veal in storage amounts to 1,329,803 pounds of fresh frozen and 397,861 pounds of fresh not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 48.7% over last year and 22.6% over last month; and fresh stocks not frozen show an increase of 10.7% over last year and a decrease of 38.6% from last month.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 7,283,414 pounds of frozen and 257,310 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show increases of 50.0% over last year and 21.5% over last month; and unfrozen stocks show decreases of 41.4% from last year and 53.2% from last month.


Stocks of poultry are as follows: Broilers 229,628 pounds; chickens 2,383,428 pounds; fowl 1,405,784 pounds; ducks 169,160 pounds; geese 211,410 pounds; turkeys 1,046,040 pounds; unclassified 606,050 pounds. Total poultry shows increases of 70.5% and 116.0% over last year and last month respectively.

Fish in storage amounts to 15,271,603 pounds of fresh frozen and 4,929,551 pounds of smoked and other varieties. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 28.5% from last year and 13.4% from last month; and smoked and other varieties show decreases of 31.3% from last year and 18.3% from last month.

During the month of November 2,106,574 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 3,640,305 pounds frozen during October.

Fresh unfrozen fish in storage amounts to 36,163 pounds as compared with 56,702 pounds in store at November first.
