COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS. JULY 1, 1933

The butter in cold storage amounts to 19,930,229 pounds of creamery and 212,368 pounds of dairy; about 1,089,000 pounds of the creamery butter total being stored in creameries with mechanical refrigeration. Creamery butter shows increases of 20.4% over last year and 279.7% over last month; and dairy butter shows a decrease of 10.9% from last year and an increase of 420.7% over last month.

Cheese stocks total 17,140,387 pounds showing increases of 6.9% and 105.2% over last year and last month respectively.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 13,592,657 dozen; fresh eggs 909,166 dozen; and frozen eggs 3,309,728 pounds. Cold storage eggs show increases of 24.4% over last year and 18.3% over last month; fresh eggs also shows increases of 9.5% over last year and 89.0% over last month; and frozen eggs show a decrease of 34.9% from last year and an increase of 7.3% over last month.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 15,760,000 pounds, fresh not frozen 3,131,585 pounds; dry salted 727,922 pounds; sweet pickled 6,380,091 pounds; in process of cure 11,015,178 pounds. Fresh frozen stocks show decreases of 16.2% from last year and 15.1% from last month; fresh stocks not frozen show decreases of 1.1% from last year and 7.5% from last month; cured dry salted stocks also show decreases of 26.1% from last year and 44.1% from last month; cured sweet pickled stocks show increases of 8.8% over last year and 8.8% over last month; and stocks in process of cure show an increase of 17.4% over last year and a decrease of .03% from last month.

The pure and prime steam lard in storage amounts to 5,992,773 pounds showing increases of 38.2% and 7.2% over last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 2,768,626 pounds of fresh frozen; 3,701,810 pounds of fresh not frozen; 210,024 pounds of cured and 202,809 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 18.3% over last year and a decrease of 11.1% from last month; fresh not frozen stocks also show an increase of 2.2% over last year and a decrease of 16.3% from last month; cured stocks show decreases of 35.8% from last year and 36.1% from last month; and stocks in process of cure show increases of 25.1% and 9.3% over last year and last month respectively.

The veal in storage amounts to 701,818 pounds of fresh frozen and 611,401 pounds of fresh not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 5.6% from last year and an increase of 13.4% over last month; and fresh stocks not frozen show increases of 33.9% over last year and 4.7% over last month.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 509,037 pounds of frozen and 212,340 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show decreases of 66.4% from last year and 17.6% from last month; and stocks not frozen show a decrease of 13.2% from last year and an increase of 20.1% over last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 114,626 pounds; chickens 593,027 pounds; fowl 355,551 pounds; ducks 139,492 pounds; geese 58,928 pounds; turkeys 1,349,583 pounds; unclassified 95,902 pounds. Total poultry shows decreases of 49.6% and 16.2% from last year and last month respectively.

Fish stocks total 8,784,086 pounds of fresh frozen and 4,668,945 pounds of smoked and other varieties. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 14.0% from last year and an increase of 50.5% over last month; and smoked and other varieties also show a decrease of 10.6% from last year and an increase of 16.1% over last month.

During the month of June 5,614,118 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 1,445,814 pounds frozen during May.

Fresh unfrozen fish in storage amounts to 37,866 pounds as compared with 73,377 pounds shown last month.
