

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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, FEBRUARY 1, 1935.

The butter in storage amounts to 22,344,540 pounds of creamery and 315,993 pounds of dairy. Of the creamery butter total 16,589,101 pounds are in cold storage plants and 5,755,439 pounds in creameries; of the latter amount approximately 1,220,527 pounds are in creameries added to the list since March 1, 1934. Creamery butter in cold storage shows an increase of 52.7% over last year and a decrease of 29.7% from last month. Dairy butter also shows an increase of 105.4% over last year and a decrease of 29.7% from last month.

Cheese stocks total 15,252,502 pounds showing an increase of 9.4% over last year and a decrease of 11.5% from last month.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 1,764,062 dozens; fresh eggs 309,671 dozens; and frozen eggs 1,532,368 pounds. Cold storage eggs show an increase of 1,419.0% over last year and a decrease of 49.2% from last month; fresh eggs show increases of 125.4% over last year and 22.6% over last month respectively; frozen eggs show decreases of 12.2% from last year and 25.0% from last month respectively.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh, not frozen 3,878,425 pounds; fresh frozen 9,966,724 pounds; cured or in cure 15,826,149 pounds. Fresh, not frozen stocks show increases of 21.2% over last year and 56.9% over last month respectively; fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 66.6% over last year and a decrease of 1.0% from last month; and stocks cured or in cure show increases of 5.8% over last year and 2.1% over last month respectively.

The pure lard in storage amounts to 2,378,207 pounds showing an increase of 4.8% over last year and a decrease of 9.5% from last month.

Beef stocks total 14,506,559 pounds of fresh frozen; 6,264,364 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 355,706 pounds of cured; and 217,842 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 70.0% over last year and a decrease of 19.7% from last month; fresh, not frozen stocks show increases of 27.4% and 38.2% over last year and last month respectively; cured stocks show increases of 38.2% over last year and 14.6% over last month; stocks in process of cure also show increases of 86.4% and 26.6% over last year and last month respectively.

The veal in storage amounts to 1,442,051 pounds of fresh, frozen and 407,498 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 126.2% over last year and a decrease of 44.8% from last month; and stocks not frozen show increases of 68.4% and 56.5% over last year and last month respectively.


Mutton and lamb stocks amount to 5,841,151 pounds of frozen and 248,669 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 16.7% over last year and a decrease of 19.0% from last month; and stocks not frozen also show an increase of 48.5% over last year and a decrease of 12.8% from last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- Broilers, 141,122 pounds; chickens 4,663,432 pounds; fowl 2,157,094 pounds; ducks 124,276 pounds; geese 127,613 pounds; turkeys 3,350,083 pounds; unclassified 535,945 pounds. Total poultry shows an increase of 2.9% over last year and a decrease of 6.8% from last month.

Fish stocks total 15,984,307 pounds of fresh and frozen; and 4,562,387 pounds of smoked, dried, pickled or salted. Fresh and frozen fish show an increase of 65.8% over last year and a decrease of 14.0% from last month; and smoked and other varieties show an increase of 41.3% over last year and a decrease of 6.7% from last month.

During the month of January 1,102,306 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 1,704,277 pounds frozen during December.


