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GOLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, MARCH 1, 1935.

The butter in storage amounts to 14,748,929 pounds of creamery and 290,328 pounds of dairy. Of the creamery butter total 10,738,805 pounds are in cold storage plants and 4,010,124 in creameries; of the latter amount approximately 865,000 pounds are in creameries added to the list since March 1, 1934. Creamery butter shows an increase of 99.0% over last year and a decrease of 47.7% from last month; and dairy butter also shows an increase of 45.13% over last year and a decrease of 8.5% from last month. Car-loads of butter reported by the railways in transit or at terminals, shown for the first time in this statement, amounts to 476,000 pounds.

Cheese stocks total 12,898,640 pounds showing an increase of 4.4% over last year and a decrease of 15.0% from last month.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 561,697 dozen; fresh eggs 266,044 dozen; and frozen eggs 1,459,307 pounds. Cold storage eggs shows an increase of 3,720.8% over last year and a decrease of 68.1% from last month; fresh eggs show an increase of 149.9% over last year and a decrease of 13.5% from last month; and frozen eggs also show an increase of 16.6% over last year and a decrease of 4.5% from last month. Car-loads of eggs reported by the railways in transit or at terminals amounts to 121,333 dozen.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh, not frozen 4,087,729 pounds; fresh frozen 13,008,031 pounds; and cured or in cure 16,084,999 pounds. Fresh, not frozen stocks show increases of 14.2% over last year and 9.9% over last month; fresh frozen stocks also show increases of 48.2% over last year and 31.9% over last month; and stocks cured, or in cure show a decrease of 10.2% from last year and an increase of 5.0% over last month. The pigs laid in storage amounts to 3,195,157 pounds showing increases of 10.5% and 39.7% over last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 11,226,428 pounds of fresh frozen; 5,174,144 pounds of fresh not frozen; 332,392 pounds of cured; and 175,696 pounds of beef in process of cure. Compared with last year's figures all beef stocks show increases as follows:- Fresh frozen 66.4%; fresh, not frozen 10.9%; cured 62.7%; and in process of cure 78.4%; while comparisons with last month show the following decreases:- Fresh frozen 22.5%; fresh, not frozen 17.5%; cured 6.9%; in process of cure 18.2%. The veal in storage amounts to 944,809 pounds of fresh frozen and 337,297 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 120.5% over last year and a decrease of 34.3% from last month; and fresh, not frozen stocks also show an increase of 3.9% over last year and a decrease of 17.3% from last month. 122,000 pounds were reported in transit.

Mutton and lamb stocks amount to 5,167,597 pounds of frozen and 288,109 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 31.3% over last year and a decrease of 11.5% from last month; and stocks not frozen show increases of 34.7% and 15.0% over last year and last month respectively.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:- Broilers 93,158 pounds; chickens 3,880,930 pounds; fowl 1,773,939 pounds; ducks 106,747 pounds; geese 114,607 pounds; turkeys 2,942,306 pounds; unclassified 484,610 pounds. Total poultry shows decreases of 2.3% from last year and 15.1% from last month.

Fish stocks total 12,808,705 pounds of fresh and frozen and 3,720,928 pounds of smoked, dried, pickled or salted. Fresh and frozen stocks show an increase of 95.3% over last year and a decrease of 12.1% from last month; and smoked and other varieties show an increase of 46.0% over last year and a decrease of 12.4% from last month. During the month of February 1,971,000 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 1,102,306 pounds frozen during January.

Apples in cold storage as at March 1 were 50,559 barrels, 516,309 boxes or hampers and 3,430 baskets. There was a considerable decrease in apple holdings. The number of barrels fell 26.1 per cent, boxes or hampers 27.8 per cent and baskets 65.4 per cent from last month.






Statement showing the distribution of each of the mentioned commodities in Cold Storage Warehouses and Creameries on March 1, 1935, reported according to provinces.
