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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, APRIL 1, 1935

The butter in storage amounts to 6,831,126 pounds of creamery and 262,664 pounds of dairy. Of the creamery butter total 4,674,812 pounds are in cold storage plants and 2,156,314 pounds in creameries; of the latter amount approximately 352,000 are in creameries added to the list since April 1, 1934. Creamery butter shows an increase of 79.6% over last year and a decrease of 53.5% from last month; and dairy butter also shows an increase of 1,631.0% over last year and a decrease of 10.5% from last month. Car-loads of butter reported by the railways in transit or at terminals amount to 588,000 pounds as compared with 476,000 pounds shown last month.

Cheese stocks total 12,421,935 pounds showing increases of 14.9% and .5% over last year and last month respectively.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 286,852 dozens; fresh eggs 554,451 dozens; and frozen eggs 1,149,252 pounds. Cold storage eggs show an increase of 109.1% over last year and a decrease of 48.8% from last month; fresh eggs show increases of 121.0% over last year and 111.4% over last month; and frozen eggs show an increase of 24.7% over last year and a decrease of 21.2% from last month. Car-loads of eggs reported by the railways in transit or at terminals amount to 69,333 dozens as compared with 104,000 dozens shown last month.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh, not frozen 3,511,435 pounds; fresh frozen 14,931,049 pounds; and cured or in cure 18,190,948 pounds. Fresh not frozen stocks show an increase of 1.2% over last year and a decrease of 17.1% from last month; fresh frozen stocks show increases of 40.8% over last year and 17.2% over last month; and stocks cured or in cure also show increases of 7.8% over last year and 8.9% over last month.

The pure lard in storage amounts to 3,566,336 pounds showing a decrease of 1.1% from last year and an increase of 6.0% over last month.

Beef stocks total 9,170,103 pounds of fresh frozen, 5,171,616 pounds of fresh not frozen; 395,694 pounds of cured; and 147,684 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 82.8% over last year and a decrease of 18.4% from last month; fresh not frozen stocks show increases of 17.3% and .4% over last year and last month respectively. Cured stocks also show increases of 50.9% over last year and 18.9% over last month; and stocks in process of cure show an increase of 21.7% over last year and a decrease of 16.3% from last month.

The veal in storage amounts to 712,372 pounds of fresh frozen and 403,086 pounds of fresh not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 125.6% over last year and a decrease of 24.6% from last month; and fresh not frozen stocks show a decrease of 17.3% from last year and an increase of 19.7% over last month.

Mutton and lamb stocks amount to 4,707,608 pounds of frozen and 201,882 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 82.4% over last year and a decrease of 8.9% from last month and stocks not frozen show decreases of 8.2% and 29.9% from last year and last month respectively.


Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 53,696 pounds; chickens 3,028,659 pounds; fowl 1,385,530 pounds; ducks 70,251 pounds; geese 89,803 pounds; turkeys 2,561,145 pounds; and unclassified 399,978 pounds. Total poultry shows an increase of .8% over last year and a decrease of 19.3% from last month. Car-loads of poultry reported by railways in transit or at Terminals amount to 69,000 pounds as compared with 122,000 pounds shown last month.

Fish stocks total 6,733,913 pounds of fresh and frozen and 3,184,118 pounds of smoked, dried, pickled or salted. Fresh and frozen stocks show an increase of 17.9% over last year and a decrease of 36.4% from last month; and smoked and other varieties show an increase of 26.2% over last year and a decrease of 14.5% from last month.

During the month of March 900,000 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 1,971,000 pounds frozen during February.

Apples in cold storage as at April 1 were 34,142 barrels, 246,596 boxes or hampers and 4,385 crates or baskets.






