COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS, MAY 1, 1935

The butter in storage amounts to 3,465,735 pounds of creamery and 202,103 pounds of dairy. Of the creamery butter total, 1,732,761 pounds are in cold storage plants and 1,732,974 pounds in creameries; of the latter amount approximately 372,000 pounds are in creameries added to the list since May 1, 1934. Creamery butter shows an increase of 38.0% over last year and a decrease of 50.0% from last month; and dairy butter also shows an increase of 1,660.4% over last year and a decrease of 22.2% from last month. Car-loads of butter reported by the railways in transit or at terminals amount to 196,000 pounds as compared with 588,000 pounds shown last month.

Cheese stocks total 10,908,997 pounds showing an increase of 10.7% over last year and a decrease of 14.3% from last month.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 2,237,830 dozens; fresh eggs 654,626 dozens and frozen eggs 1,625,437 pounds. Cold storage eggs show decreases of 28.2% from last year and an increase of 623.8% over last month; fresh eggs show increases of 7.2% over last year and 15.5% over last month; and frozen eggs show an increase of 95.9% over last year and 41.0% over last month. Car-loads of eggs reported by the railways in transit or at terminals amount to 206,280 dozens as compared with 58,920 dozens shown last month.

Pork stocks are as follows: fresh, not frozen 2,914,745 pounds; fresh frozen 13,660,808 pounds and cured or in cure 24,919,333 pounds. Fresh, not frozen stocks show ~~decreases~~ ^{increases} of 17.4% from last year and 12.7% from last month; fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 21.3% over last year and a decrease of 3.7% from last month, and stocks cured or in cure show decreases of 13.5% from last year and 17.0% from last month. ^{7.7} ^{11.4}

The pure lard in storage amounts to 2,671,425 pounds showing ~~decreases~~ ^{increases} of 26.0% and 22.4% from last year and last month respectively.

Beef stocks total 7,722,348 pounds of fresh frozen; 5,240,019 pounds of fresh not frozen; 517,627 pounds of cured; and 259,327 pounds of beef in process of cure. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 59.9% over last year and a decrease of 25.4% from last month; fresh not frozen stocks show increases of 20.5% over last year and 2.7% over last month; cured stocks show increases of 170.2% over last year and 31.1% over last month and stocks in process of cure also show increases of 139.0% over last year and 76.4% over last month.


The veal in storage amounts to 780,272 pounds of fresh frozen and 264,100 pounds of fresh not frozen. Fresh frozen stocks show increases of 51.6% over last year and 10.9% over last month; fresh not frozen stocks also show increases of 34.0% over last year and 120.6% over last month.

Mutton and lamb stocks total 3,102,639 pounds of frozen and 203,100 pounds of not frozen. Frozen stocks show an increase of 73.7% over last year and a decrease of 27.4% from last month; not frozen stocks show increases of 48.1% over last year and 2.4% over last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows: broilers 41,576 pounds; chickens 2,139,298 pounds; fowl 1,014,513 pounds; ducks 58,502 pounds; geese 84,002 pounds; turkeys 1,929,932 pounds; unclassified 274,444 pounds. Total poultry shows decreases of 6.9% and 25.3% from last year and last month respectively. Car-loads of poultry reported by railways in transit or at terminals amount to 44,000 pounds as compared with 59,000 pounds shown last month.

Fish stocks total 6,306,559 pounds of fresh frozen and 3,684,287 pounds of smoked, dried, pickled or salted. Fresh frozen stocks show an increase of 25.9% over last year and a decrease of 21.3% from last month; and smoked and other varieties show increases of 21.4% and 7.8% over last year and last month respectively. During the month of April 1,749,730 pounds of fish were frozen as compared with 900,000 pounds frozen during March.


