The Internal Trade Division of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics publishes the following report concerning stocks of food in cold storage and in process of cure on December 1, 1919:-

The butter in storage on December 1st, amounted to 16,629,818 lbs. of creamery and 900,127 of dairy. Comparative figures show this in the case of creamery butter to be 2.74 per cent less than last year and 23.08 per cent less than last month, and in the case of dairy butter to be 49.69 per cent less than last December and 24.16 per cent less than last month.

The oleomargarine in storage amounts to 482,205 pounds. Comparative figures show this to be 45.37 per cent less than last December and 15.9 per cent less than last month.

The cheese in storage amounts to 27,018,412 pounds. While this is shown by comparative figures to be 4.11 per cent less than last month, it is 576.7 per cent more than last year.

The eggs in cold storage amount to 5,111,364 doz. Comparative figures show a decline of 28.82 per cent from last month and 2.27 per cent more than last year. Eggs other than cold storage amount to 444,135 doz. Frozen eggs amount to 469,310 pounds, 35.64 per cent more than last month, but 82.34 per cent less than last year.

The pork stocks are 1,936,628 lbs. of frozen, 2,441,362 lbs. fresh unfrozen, 1,785,125 lbs. dry salted, 5,614,235 lbs. sweet pickled and 17,628,732 lbs. in process of cure. This latter is not in cold storage and is more than one half the total. Comparative figures show the following:- fresh frozen, decreased 32.81 per cent as compared with last year and increased 16.1 per cent from last month; fresh unfrozen decreased 7.05 per cent from last month and is 55.54 per cent less than last December; dry salted, decreased 7.98 per cent from last month and is 59.86 per cent less than last December; sweet pickled decreased 55.99 per cent from last month and is 50.20 per cent less than last year; in process of cure is 15.2 per cent less than last month and 3 per cent more than last year; the total being 26.02 per cent less than last month and 28.48 per cent less than last year.

The beef stocks amount to 32,923,773 lbs. of fresh frozen, 7,896,243 lbs. fresh unfrozen, 236,257 lbs. cured, 375,833 lbs. in process of cure. Comparative figures show the following:- fresh frozen increased 63.1 per cent since last month and is 23.31 per cent less than last year; fresh unfrozen increased 18.56 per cent and is 22.38 per cent more than last year; cured decreased 62.82 per cent from last month and is 90.37 per cent less than last year; stocks in process of cure decreased 42.58 per cent from last month and are 27.28 per cent less than last year; the total increased 48.09 per cent from last month and is 30.84 per cent less than last year.

Stocks of mutton and lamb amount to 8,043,089 lbs. of which 7,385,625 lbs. are frozen and 657,466 lbs. unfrozen. Comparative figures show an increase of 77.19 per cent from last month and a decrease of 3.19 per cent compared with last year.

The Internal Trade Division of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics publishes the following report concerning stocks of food in cold storage and in process of cure on December 1, 1919:-

The butter in storage on December 1st, amounted to 16,639,818 lbs. of creamery and 900,127 of dairy. Comparative figures show this in the case of creamery butter to be 3.74 per cent less than last year and 23.08 per cent less than last month, and in the case of dairy butter to be 49.69 per cent less than last December and 24.16 per cent less than last month.

The oleomargarine in storage amounts to 482,205 pounds. Comparative figures show this to be 45.37 per cent less than last December and 15.9 per cent less than last month.


The cheese in storage amounts to 27,018,412 pounds. While this is shown by comparative figures to be 4.11 per cent less than last month, it is 376.7 per cent more than last year.

The eggs in cold storage amount to 5,111,364 doz. Comparative figures show a decline of 28.82 per cent from last month and 2.27 per cent more than last year. Eggs other than cold storage amount to 444,135 doz. Frozen eggs amount to 469,310 pounds, 35.64 per cent more than last month, but 82.54 per cent less than last year.

The pork stocks are 1,936,628 lbs. of frozen, 2,441,362 lbs. fresh unfrozen, 1,785,123 lbs. dry salted, 5,614,235 lbs. sweet pickled and 17,628,732 lbs. in process of cure. This latter is not in cold storage and is more than one half the total. Comparative figures show the following:- fresh frozen, decreased 32.81 per cent as compared with last year and increased 16.1 per cent from last month; fresh unfrozen decreased 7.05 per cent from last month and is 35.54 per cent less than last December; dry salted, decreased 7.98 per cent from last month and is 59.86 per cent less than last December; sweet pickled decreased 56.99 per cent from last month and is 50.20 per cent less than last year; in process of cure is 18.2 per cent less than last month and 3 per cent more than last year; the total being 26.02 per cent less than last month and 26.48 per cent less than last year.


The beef stocks amount to 32,928,773 lbs. of fresh frozen, 7,896,243 lbs. fresh unfrozen, 236,257 lbs. cured, 375,835 lbs. in process of cure. Comparative figures show the following:- fresh frozen increased 63.1 per cent since last month and is 23.31 per cent less than last year; fresh unfrozen increased 18.66 per cent and is 22.38 per cent more than last year; cured decreased 62.82 per cent from last month and is 90.37 per cent less than last year; stocks in process of cure decreased 42.58 per cent from last month and are 27.28 per cent less than last year; the total increased 48.09 per cent from last month and is 20.84 per cent less than last year.

Stocks of mutton and lamb amount to 8,043,089 lbs. of which 7,385,623 lbs. are frozen and 657,466 lbs. unfrozen. Comparative figures show an increase of 77.19 per cent from last month and a decrease of 5.19 per cent compared with last year.




Stocks of poultry are as follows:- broilers 208,125 lbs., chickens 1,245,827 lbs., fowl 931,231 lbs., ducks 57,612 lbs., geese 86,803 lbs., turkeys 299,925 lbs., unclassified 284,180 lbs. The total is 24.2 per cent less than last December. The following increases from last month are shown:- broilers 19.45 per cent, chickens 194.34 per cent, fowl 118.59 per cent, ducks 80.06 per cent, geese 228.43 per cent, turkeys 341.51 per cent, unclassified 139.69 per cent, total 145.09 per cent.

Fish stocks are at last showing some decline. On December 1st, cold storage stocks were 20,390,075 lbs., and 7,567,103 lbs. were on hand other than in cold storage. Comparative figures show a decrease of cold storage stocks from last month of 23.8 per cent and 118.72 per cent increase of other than cold storage stocks, with a decrease of 8.84 per cent in the total.
