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COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS MARCH 1, 1925.
GENERAL SUMMARY

The butter in storage amounts to 12,311,507 pounds of creamery and 388,394 pounds of dairy. Creamery butter shows an increase of 61.86% over last year and a decrease of 30.22% from last month and dairy butter also shows an increase of 24.33% over last year and a decrease of 13.38% from last month.

Cheese stocks show 6,910,016 pounds in store being a decrease of 30.25% from last year and 31.85% from last month.

Eggs in cold storage amount to 103,540 dozen; other than cold storage 327,419 dozen and frozen eggs 695,460 pounds. Comparative figures show a decrease of 15.49% from last year and 69.20% from last month in cold storage eggs; other than cold storage shows a decrease of 7.44% from last year and an increase of 50.06% over last month; frozen eggs show an increase of 8.99% over last year and a decrease of 7.54% from last month.

Pork stocks are as follows:- fresh frozen 25,372,956 pounds; fresh, not frozen 2,781,099 pounds; cured, dry salted 2,563,191 pounds; cured, sweet pickled 9,523,704 pounds; in process of cure 12,836,507 pounds. Comparative figures show fresh frozen pork to have increased 21.75% over last year and decreased 3.43% from last month; pork not frozen shows a decrease of 46.58% from last year and 10.65% from last month; cured, dry salted shows a decrease of 51.19% from last year and an increase of 39.13% over last month; cured, sweet pickled shows an increase of 6.28% over last year and a decrease of 5.53% from last month; pork in process of cure shows a decrease of .28% from last year and an increase of 13.55% over last month.

The lard in storage amounts to 3,271,527 pounds being a decrease of 3.96% from last year and an increase of 5.25% over last month.

Beef stocks amount to 13,156,500 pounds of fresh frozen; 3,516,523 pounds of fresh, not frozen; 218,298 pounds of cured and 308,658 pounds of beef, in process of cure. Comparative figures show frozen beef to have increased 36.92% over last year and decreased 27.77% from last month; beef, not frozen shows a decrease of 35.89% from last year and 27.71% from last month; cured beef shows an increase of 95.73% over last year and a decrease of 14.20% from last month; beef in process of cure shows an increase of 126.64% over last year and 12.56% over last month.

The veal in storage amounts to 1,344,533 pounds of fresh frozen and 101,431 pounds of fresh, not frozen. Comparative figures show decreases of 26.69% and 22.38% from last month in frozen stocks and not frozen respectively.

Mutton and Lamb stocks show a total of 4,695,449 pounds of frozen and 98,905 pounds of not frozen. Comparative figures show frozen stocks to have increased 27.74% over last year and to have decreased 10.57% from last month; not frozen stocks show a decrease of 63.97% from last year and 42.66% from last month.

Stocks of poultry are as follows:-broilers 278,876 pounds; chickens 2,781,134 pounds; fowl 1,424,766 pounds; ducks 119,475 pounds; geese 202,029 pounds; turkeys 1,604,163 pounds; unclassified 949,450 pounds. The total of 7,359,893 pounds shows an increase of 30.50% over last year and a decrease of 7.74% from last month.

Fish stocks show 10,666,666 pounds of fresh frozen and 3,650,984 pounds of other in cold storage. Fresh frozen stocks show a decrease of 7.66% from last year and 19.92% from last month and other in cold storage shows an increase of 114.73% over last year and 2.95% over last month.
