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## PACKOF RUITS ADD VEGETABLES, 1931

Ctta* Eebruez - 1922. The Jominion Eurean of Statistics presents heremith an interim report on the pack of fruits and vegetables during the calendar year 1931 . A questionnaire was mailed to 220 indivicual plants requesting the quantity of fruits and vegetables canned during the year. Replies were received from 209 establishments of which 151 were operating in 193l. Wleven plants have not been heard from at the time of writing this report. Some of these plants did very little canning in previous years While in tho case of a fem others it would be safe to assume that they did not operate in 1931. The Tielirinary firures cor 193l, therefore, include about 95 per cent of the total production of canned fruits anc vegetables in Canada.

Comparative f: gures of the pack of frults and vegetables for the calendar years 1930 and 1931 are presented in the following sumary by provinces. Compared with the previous year there was a decrease of $2,789,647$ cases of canned vegetables and 539 , 852 cases of canned soms. The pack of tomatoes and peas was considerably lower than in the previous year while that of corn was 278,71 cases higher.

Imports and exports of canned fruits and vegetables for the calendar years 1930 and 1951 are given in Tables (c) and (d). Imports of canned vegetables totalled $8,424,603$ pounds as against $16,976,678$ poumis in 1930. Imports of canned iruits were also lower, dropping from $42, C 15,895$ pounds in 1930 to $31,526,224$ pounds in 1931. Exports of both canned fruits and vegttakles in 1931 vere, however, higher, the former increasing by 2,040,926 pounds and the latter by $2,298,943$ pounds.
