# PRELIMINARY REPORT ON THE PRODUCTION OF DAIRY FACTORIES IN CANADA, 1927.

The output of dairy factories in Canada in 1927 had a total value of \$133,927,256, an increase of about half a million dollars over the preceding year. The production of creamery butter increased in quantity by over a million pounds and in value by nearly five million dollars. The production of cheese, on the other hand, decreased in quantity by nearly 34 million pounds and in value by three million dollars.

Creamery Butter. The production of creamery butter in 1927 amounted to 178,435.013 lb., valued at \$66,070,160, compared with 177,209,287 lb., valued at \$61,753,390 in 1926. The quantity made in 1927 is the second highest in the history of the industry, while the value exceeds that of any other year and is higher than the previous record year for value -1920- by two and a half million dollars. The average price per lb. in 1927 was 37.03 cents compared with 34.85 cents in 1926. The Maritime Provinces, Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia show increased production while decreases are recorded by the Prairie Provinces. The relation which each province bears to the total quantity of production is shown by the following, the figures for 1920 being enclosed in brackets: Ontario 37 p.c. (35); Quebec 32 p.c. (29); Alberta 9 p.c. (11); Manitoba 8 p.c. (9); Saskatchewan 7 p.c. (9); Nova Scotia 3 p.c. (3); British Columbia 2 p.c. (2); Prince Edward Island 1 p.c. (1); and New Brunswick 1 p.c. (1). The highest average price per lb. is shown by British Columbia with 42.53 cents, and the lowest by Alberta 35.63 cents.

Factory Cheese. The production of factory cheese in 1927 was 138,026,861 lb., valued at \$25,517,355, a decrease in quantity from the preceding year of 33,704,770 lb., and a decrease in value of \$3,290,486. The average price per lb. in 1927 was 18.49 cents, an increase of nearly 2 cents over the price paid in 1926. The production of cheese in Ontario in 1927 represents 70 p.c. and that of Quebec 27 p.c. of the total production for the Dominion. The highest average price per pound is shown by British Columbia, with 24.44 cents, and the lowest by Quebec with 18.14 cents.

Condensed and Evaporated Milk, Milk Powder, etc. The total value of these products in 1927 was \$10,186,312, compared with \$9,601,138 in 1926. The production of condensed milk and condensed skim milk amounted to 38,017,837 lb., an increase of 1,908,931 lb.; overporated milk 51.854,663 lb., an increase of7,671,172 lb.; and milk powder, skim milk powder and cream powder, 15,113,983 lb., an

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increase of 1,002,967 lb. The quantity of casein made was 862,378 lb., an increase of 259,524 lb.

milk sold by the factories to be used as such. The quantity in 1927 (exclusive of Quebec Province for which the figures are not available) was 41,779,473 gal., an increase over the preceding year of 1,331,460 gal. The cream figures are incomplete as the Quebec figure has not yet been received.

Other items include whey butter, cream, whey cream, buttermilk, ice cream mix, and sundries. The total value of all miscellaneous products in 1927 was \$32,153,429, compared with \$33,190,707 in 1926.

Number of Dairy Factories. The total number of dairy factories in operation in 1927 was 2,988, compared with 3,047 in 1926. The total for 1927 includes 1,355 creameries, an increase of 86 over the preceding year; 1,333 cheese factories, a decrease of 85; 273 combined butter and cheese factories, a decrease of 61; and 27 condenseries, an increase of 1. The average value of output per factory was \$44,822, compared with \$43,765 in 1926.

#### IMPORTS AND EXPORTS

Imports. The quantity of butter imported into Canada in 1927 was 11,208,819 lb., compared with 9,151,882 lb. in 1926, and the quantity of cheese 1,720,797 lb., compared with 1,218,626 lb. Of the total butter imports 78 p.c. came from New Zealand and 18 p.c. from the United Kingdom, while for the cheese imports the countries of origin were the United Kingdom, the United States, France, Italy and Switzerland. The total value of all imports of dairy products in 1927 was \$4,539,269, compared with \$3,965,769 in 1926.

Exports. Nearly all of the butter made in Canada is used for home consumption, the exports amounting to only a few million pounds annually. In 1927 the quantity exported was 2,696,000 lb., compared with 9,814,000 lb. in 1926. The quantity of cheese exported in 1927 was 110,533,000 lb., which is the smallest export for a number of years. Milk and cream show decreases in quantity exported, compared with the preceding year. The total value of all exports of dairy products in 1927 was \$35,187,529, compared with \$41,322,084 in 1926.

#### HOME CONSUMPTION

A preliminary estimate of the consumption of butter in Canada, per capita, in 1927 places it at 28.88 lb., compared with 28.44 lb. in 1926. The estimated per capita consumption of choose was 3.38 lb., compared with 4.04 lb.


