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PRODUCTION OF DAIRY FACTORIES, CANADA, 1938

The annual statistics of dairy factories are issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the provincial departments of agriculture. The present statement deals with production only. The complete report, to be issued at a later date, will include, in addition, statistics, by provinces and counties or districts, of such items as deliveries of milk and cream, amounts paid to patrons, capital, employees, salaries and wages, and related data.

Creamery Butter. - The quantity of creamery butter made during the year 1938 was 267.347.271 pounds, valued at \$66.534,568, an increase in quantity compared with the preceding year, of 20,290,525 pounds, or 8 per cent, and an increase in value of \$2.317.236, or 4 per cent. The natrage price per pound was 24.89 cents, compared with 25.99 cents in 1937. The position occupied by each province with respect to the total quantity produced in Canada in 1938 is shown by the following statement of percentages: Ontario, 32.8 per cent; Quebec, 29.8 per cent; Alberta, 11.7 per cent; Manitoba, 9.6 per cent; Saskatchewan, 8.8 per cent; Nova Scotia, 2.5 per cent; British Columbia, 2.1 per cent; New Brunswick, 1.7 per cent; and Prince Edward Island, 1.0 per cent. Increases in production, compared with the preceding year, are recorded for all provinces excepting Saskatchewan, which shows a decrease of 47,678 pounds. The highest average price per pound is recorded by Nova Scotia, with 27.76 cents.

Factory Cheese. - The production of factory cheese amounted to 123,971,308 pounds, valued at \$16,809,861, a decrease in quantity from the preceding year of 6,654,530 pounds, or 5 per cent, and a decrease in value of \$1,155,262, or 6 per cent. The average price per pound was 13.56 cents, compared with 13.75 cents in 1937. Ontario and Quebec, together, contribute 94 per cent to the total Canadian make, Ontario's share amounting to 87,593,430 pounds, or 71 per cent, and Quebec's to 28,569,124 pounds, or 23 per cent. Production is larger than in the preceding year in each of the prairie provinces and British Columbia, but decreases are shown in Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island. No factory cheese is produced in Nova Scotia.

Concentrated Milk. - The value of all items of concentrated milk, combined was \$11,844,817, compared with \$10,066,749 in 1937. Comprised in the total value for 1938 are the various items under the head of "concentrated whole milk", amounting to \$9,373,002, and the items classed as concentrated milk by-products, valued at \$2,471,815.

Miscellaneous Products of Dairy Factories. - Included in this classification are all products of dairy factories other than butter, cheese and concentrated milk. The chief items are ice cream, and milk and cream sold as such. The value of all items under this classification is \$45,660,110, compared with \$43,933,674 in 1937. Decreases are recorded in the quantity and value of ice cream made and of cream sold (expressed in pounds of butter fat), while increases are shown for milk sold.

Total Value of Output. - The total value of production of the dairy factory industry in 1938 was \$140,849,356, to which the production of creamery butter contributed 47 per cent; of factory cheese, 13 per cent; of concentrated milk products, 8 per cent; and of miscellaneous factory products, 33 per cent. The total value shows an increase of \$4,366,478, or 3 per cent, compared with the preceding year.

Number of Dairy Factories. - The number of dairy factories in operation during the year was 2,552, classified as follows: creameries, 1,344; cheese factories, 988; combined butter and cheese factories, 196; and concentrated milk factories, 24. Compared with the preceding year the total number shows a decrease of 6.

FOREIGN TRADE

Exports. - The value of exports of the Canadian dairy industry in 1938 was \$16,219,789, of which the export of cheese accounted for \$11,874,223, or 73 per cent. Second in importance is evaporated milk, the total of \$2,199,179 representing 14 per cent of the total export of dairy products. The total value of all dairy products exported shows a reduction from the preceding year of \$1,361,288, or 8 per cent.

Imports. - The dairy products imported into Canada, for consumption, had a total value of \$1,788,308, compared with \$462,098 in 1937. The increase is due to the larger imports of butter, of which 5,231,838 pounds were received in 1938, compared with 65,918 pounds in 1937.
