PRODUCTION OF DAIRY FACTORIES, CAMADA, 1939

The annual statistics of dairy factories are issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the provincial departments of agriculture. The present statement deals with production only. The complete report, to be issued at a later date, will include statistics, by provinces and counties or districts, of production, deliveries of milk and cream, amounts paid to patrons, capital, employees, salaries and wages and related data.

Creamery Butter. Canada's production of creamery butter in 1939 totalled 267,-612,546 pounds and marks a high record for the industry to that year. The value aggregated \$61,748,399. Compared with the year 1938 the quantity of product records an increase of 265,275 pounds, or 1/10 of one per cent, but the aggregate value, owing to lower prices, decreased by \$4,786,169, or 7 p.c. The average price per pound in 1939 was 23.07 cents compared with 24.89 cents in the preceding year. Ontario and Quebec are the chief producing provinces, their combined output in 1939 representing 62.9 p.c. of the total for Canada. The relation which the production of each province bears to the total Canadian output is shown by the following percentages: Ontario, 32.9 p.c.; Quebec, 30.0 p.c.; Alberta, 11.1 p.c.; Manitoba, 9.9 p.c.; Saskatchewan, 9.5 p.c.; British Columbia, 2.3 p.c.; Nova Scotia, 2.1 p.c.; New Brunswick, 1.5 p.c.; and Prince Edward Island, 0.7 p.c. The highest average prices were reported, as in previous years, by Nova Scotia and British Columbia - 26.19 cents per pound for the former province and 26.15 cents for the latter.

Factory Cheese.— The production of factory cheese in 1939 amounted to 125,475,—359 pounds, an increase over 1938 of 1,504,051 pounds, or 1 p.c. The aggregate value of the product was \$15,311,782, a decrease from 1938 of \$1,498,079 pounds, or 9 p.c., the reduction being due to a lower average price. For the year 1939 the average price per pound was 12.20 cents, while in 1938 it was 13.56 cents. Ontario and Quebec, together, produced 93.6 p.c. of the total quantity of factory cheese made in Canada during the year. The position of each province with respect to the total make is shown by percentage as follows: Ontario, 71.7 p.c.; Quebec, 21.9 p.c.; Manitoba, 2.8 p.c.; Alberta, 1.8 p.c.; British Columbia, 0.7 p.c.; New Brunswick, 0.4 p.c.; Prince Edward Island, 0.4 p.c.; and Saskatchewan, 0.3 p.c. No factory cheese is made in Nova Scotia.

Concentrated Milk.— The combined production in 1939 of all items included in the classification of "concentrated milk" was 167,247,438 pounds, and the value was \$11,594,180, an increase in quantity over the preceding year of 9,323,545 pounds, or 6 p.c., but a decrease in value of \$250,637, or 2 p.c. Contributing chiefly to the decrease in total value were the lower prices of the two principal items, viz., evaporated whole milk (case goods) and skim milk powder. For the former the average price per pound in 1939 was 6.3 cents, compared with 7.1 cents in 1938, and for the latter, 7.0 cents, compared with 7.4 cents.

Miscellaneous Products of Dairy Factories,— This group includes ice cream, whey butter, milk and cream sold, and sundries. The combined value of the various items was \$47,158,434, compared with \$45,660,110 in 1938.


Total Value of Output. The total value of production of the dairy factory industry in 1939 was \$135,812,795, to which the production of creamery butter contributed 45 p.c.; of factory cheese, 11 p.c.; of concentrated milk, 9 p.c.; and of miscellaneous factory products, 35 p.c. Compared with the preceding year the total value shows a decrease of \$5,036,561, or 4 p.c.

Number of Dairy Factories.— The number of dairy factories in operation during the year was 2,551, classified as follows: creameries, 1,301; cheese factories, 1,007; combined butter and cheese factories, 220; and concentrated milk factories, 23. Compared with the preceding year the total number of factories shows a decrease of 1.

FOREIGN TRADE

Exports. The value of Canadian dairy products exported during the year was \$18,-221,708, an increase over 1938 of \$2,001,919, or 12 p.c. The principal item is cheese, whose value represented 67 p.c. of the total exports. Butter was second with 15 p.c., of the total, evaporated milk, third, with 10 p.c., and whole milk powder, fourth with 7 p.c. For the four items combined, the percentage of total was 99.

Imports.— The imports of dairy products fell in value to \$454,843 from \$1,788,—308 in 1938. The decrease is due to the drop in butter imports from 5,231,838 pounds, valued at \$1,411,958, to 5,644 pounds, valued at \$1,656 in 1939. Cheese and casein were the principal items of import in 1939.




1. - Production of Creamery Butter in Canada, by Provinces, 1938 and 1939.
