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PRODUCTION OF DAIRY FACTORIES, CANADA, 1941

The annual statistics of dairy factories are issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the provincial departments of agriculture. The present statement deals with production only. The complete report, to be issued at a later date, will include statistics, by provinces and counties or districts, of production, deliveries of milk and cream, amounts paid to patrons, capital, employees, salaries and wages, and other data.

Creamery Butter. - The production of creamery butter in Canada in the year 1941 is the largest ever recorded by the industry - a total of 285,848,196 pounds. This amount exceeds the production of 1940 by 21,124,527 pounds, or 8 per cent, and that of the previous high record year (1939) by 18,235,650 pounds, or 7 per cent. The total value marks a high record also, with a total of \$93,199,557, an increase over 1940 of \$28,290,576, or 44 per cent, and an increase over 1939 of \$31,451,158, or 51 per cent. The average price per pound for the year was 32,60 cents, compared with 24,52 cents in 1940 and 23,07 cents in 1939.

Factory Cheese. The production of factory cheese amounted to 151,865,538 pounds, an increase over 1940 of 6,527,000 pounds or 4 per cent, and an increase over 1939 of 26,390,179 pounds, or 21 per cent. The value of the cheese manufactured during the year was \$24,737,037, an increase over 1940 of \$4,825,832, or 24 per cent, and an increase over 1939 of \$9,425,255, or 62 per cent. The average price per pound has advanced from 12,20 in 1939 to 13,70 in 1940 and to 16,29 combs in 1941.

Total Value of Output of Dairy Factories. - The value of all products of dairy factories (butter, cheese, concentrated milk, ice cream, etc.) in 1941 was \$201,661,441, compared with \$151,509,541 in 1940 and \$135,812,795 in 1939.

Number of Dairy Factories. - The factories in operation in 1941 numbered 2,452, classified as follows: Creameries, 1,211; cheese factories, 968; combined butter and cheese factories, 248; and concentrated milk plants, 25. Compared with the preceding year, the total number of factories shows a decrease of 57.
