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PRODUCTION OF DAIRY FACTORIES, CANADA, 1942

The annual statistics of dairy factories are issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the provincial departments of agriculture. The present statement deals with production only. The complete report, to be issued at a later date, will include statistics, by provinces and counties or districts, of production, deliveries of milk and cream, amounts paid to patrons, capital, employees, salaries and wages, and other data.

Creamery Butter. - The production of creamery butter in Canada in the year 1942 amounted to 284,591,372 pounds, valued at \$97,740,910 compared with 285,848,196 pounds, valued at \$93,199,557 in the preceding year. The quantity made in 1942 is the second highest in the history of the industry, while the value exceeds that of any other year. The average price per pound for the year was 34.34 cents, an increase over 1941 of nearly 2 cents. The Maritime Provinces and the Prairie Provinces show increased production, while decreases are recorded for Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia.

Factory Cheese. - The production of factory cheese in 1942 amounted to 206,935,464 pounds, valued at \$41,274,246, an increase in quantity over 1941 of 55,069,926 pounds and an increase in value of \$16,537,209. The average price per pound in 1942 was 19.95 cents, compared with 16.29 cents paid in 1941. The production of cheese in Ontario represents 62 p.c. and that of Quebec 32 p.c. of the total production for the Dominion.

Total Value of Output of Dairy Factories. - The value of all products of dairy factories in 1942 amounted to \$236,098,998 compared with \$201,661,441 for the year 1941, an increase of \$34,437,557.

Number of Dairy Factories. - The total number of dairy factories in operation in 1942 was 2,404. This total includes 1,141 creameries, 977 cheese factories, 260 combined butter and cheese factories and 26 concentrated milk plants. The creameries show a decrease of 70, the cheese factories an increase of 9, the combined butter and cheese factories an increase of 12 and the concentrated milk plants an increase of 1 over the year 1941.
