THE STARCH AND GLUCOSE INDUSTRY IN CANADA1921 and 1922

Ottawa, April, 1924.- The Dominion Bureau of Statistics presents herewith a report on the Starch and Glucose industry in Canada for the calendar years 1921 and 1922. In 1921 there were 7 active establishments, 3 in the province of Ontario and 2 each in Quebec and Prince Edward Island. In 1922 the total operating plants had risen to 9, of which Prince Edward contributed 3 additional factories making 5 in all, Ontario remained the same as the previous year with 3, and Quebec reported only one establishment. In order not to divulge the operations of any individual establishment statistics relating to Prince Edward Island and Quebec have been combined and are shown throughout this report under the heading of "other provinces".

PRINCIPAL STATISTICS

Table 1 gives the principal statistics of the industry by provinces for the years 1921 and 1922.

THE STARCH AND GLUCOSE INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1921-22.PRODUCTION

The quantity and selling value at the factory of the principal products of the industry is shown in Table II by provinces for the calendar years 1921 and 1922. Although there was a net increase of two factories over the two year period, there was a considerable reduction in both the quantity produced and the value, which fell from \$4,436,323 in 1921 to \$3,871,977 in 1922, being an increase of \$564,351. The only individual item of products which showed an increase was "laundry starch" which rose from 6,619,667 pounds valued at \$386,402 in 1922 to 8,179,983 pounds valued at \$424,425 in 1922, being an increased output of 1,560,321 pounds worth \$38,023.

THE STARCH AND GLUCOSE INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1921-22.CAPITAL INVESTMENT

The amount of capital employed in the industry is shown by items for the provinces during the calendar years 1921-22 in Table III. Over the two year period there was a net decrease of \$212,367 in the amount of capital employed. Dividing this into two parts, viz., fixed and working capital, it will be seen that the former expanded to the extent of \$140,185, whilst the latter suffered a reduction amounting to \$352,552.

EMPLOYEES, SALARIES AND WAGES

Table IV presents the number of persons employed in the industry, by classes of employment and sex, and also gives the amount paid in salaries and wages during the calendar years 1921-22. The office force was augmented by 9 and the salary list increased by \$1,576 during the two year period, but in spite of the fact that two additional establishments reported operations during 1922, there was a considerable reduction in the average number of wage earners. The number of male workers fell from 556 in 1921 to 424 in 1922 and the female workers, 28 in number, employed during the latter year was a little less than 50 per cent of the previous year's total of 58. The payroll also diminished to the extent of \$244,260.

THE STARCH AND GLUCOSE INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1921-1922.OTHER LABOUR STATISTICS

Statistics regarding the number of days the plants were in operation and the number of hours normally worked by wage earners are given in Table V for the calendar years 1921 and 1922. The outstanding feature is the marked increase in the number of days the plants were entirely idle, viz., from an average of 107.85 days per establishment in 1921 to 156.55 days in 1922.

POWER STATISTICS

Table VI gives the number of units and the horse-power capacity according to manufacturers rating of the various classes of power employed in the industry, for the two years 1921-22. Electrical energy takes first place in each year with 127 motors with a total capacity of 2,678 indicated horsepower in 1921 and 166 motors with 2,467 horsepower capacity during 1922.

FUEL CONSUMPTION

The quantity and value of the different kinds of fuel used in the industry is given in Table VII for the calendar years 1921 and 1922. Bituminous coal takes first place during both years, although there was a reduction in the quantity consumed during 1922, of 6,379 tons with a decreased valuation of \$124,333.

MATERIALS USED

The quantity and cost value delivered at the factory of the principal materials used in the industry during the calendar years 1921 and 1922, are given in Table IX. Corn takes first place during the two-year period, although there was a considerable reduction in both the quantity and the value. The quantity and value reported for the year 1921 was 109,067,144 pounds at a cost of \$1,467,809; during the following year this fell to 104,782,816 pounds, worth \$1,422,435, being a decrease of 4,284,328 pounds valued at \$45,344.
