THE SASH, DOOR, AND PLANING-MILL INDUSTRY IN CAMADA

1930 AID 1931.

Ottawa, March 1933.— A report on the sash, door and planing-mill industry in Canada for 1930 and 1931, has just been compiled by the Forestry Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This industry includes planing-mills, and mills engaged primarily in the manufacture of builders' millwork. The chief products of the industry consisting of sash, doors, frames, blinds, millwork, moulding, matched and planed lumber, veneer and plywood amounted in 1931 to \$21,376,341, as compared to \$28,627,615 in 1930. In addition to their principal products, many of these mills manufacture also, as side lines and by-products, other wooden commodities such as hardwood flooring, boxes and containers, sporting goods, furniture and cabinetwork, vehicle supplies, boats, handles, woodenware, tanks, etc. The total value of these secondary products in 1931 was \$4,843,132, and in 1930 \$2,106,873. The total value of all products of the industry was \$26,219,473 in 1931 and \$36,483,594 in 1930.


There were 673 establishments in this class in 1931 and 728 in 1930. Their production includes the greater part of the sash, doors and mill-work made in Canada, but there are a number of other establishments classified under other industrial groups that manufacture these commodities as side lines to their principal products.

The industry in 1931 gave employment to 7,952 people, consisting of 1,374 male and 222 female employees on a salary basis, and 6,303 male and 53 female employees paid on wages. The total payroll in 1931 was \$8,346,474 and in 1930 \$10,981,763.

The raw materials of the industry consists chiefly of rough sawn lumber which in 1931 was used to the extent of 324,359 M ft. b.m. of softwood valued at \$9,575,532 and 42,689 M ft. of hardwood valued at \$2,208,386. Other raw materials consisted of logs and bolts of both softwood and hardwood, together with veneer, iron and steel, glass, hardware, paints, oils, etc. The total value of all materials in 1931 was \$13,703,622 and in 1930 \$19,220,215. The total value of fuel purchased was \$126,197 and the power employed in the industry amounted to over forty-four thousand horse-power.

The total capital invested in the industry in 1931 amounted to \$40,790,104, as compared to \$49,333,121 in 1930. This capital was distributed as follows:- land, buildings, machinery and tools, 50 per cent, materials and stocks on hand 18 per cent, value of finished products 5 per cent, cash and accounts, 27 per cent.

Details concerning these different aspects of the industry are given in the following tables, the first of which is a summary, by provinces, of the principal statistics of the industry.








