THE COOPERAGE INDUSTRY, 1944.

Ottawa, July, 1946. - The Cooperage industry includes all establishments engaged wholly or principally in the manufacture of barrels, casks, kegs, tubs, etc. Some of these plants manufacture their own staves and heading in the same establishment as that in which the barrels are assembled and sometimes dispose of surplus cooperage stock, but for the most part they purchase such stock from the stave, heading and hoop mills belonging to the sawmill industry. There are also a number of establishments classified in other industries which manufacture stock and assemble barrels as a side line or for their own use. It should therefore be borne in mind that the figures herein given refer only to those establishments whose main business is the production of complete barrels and similar containers.

There were 66 establishments in this group in 1944, distributed as follows: Nova Scotia 27, Ontario 16, New Brunswick 11, Quebec 7, British Columbia 4, and Manitoba 1.

The table below gives the principal statistics of the industry for 1943 and 1944 and shows increases for all items.

Complete figures on the production of cooperage and cooperage stock by all industrial groups and further details concerning this group will be given in a later report on the wood-using industries as a whole.
