

THE BED, SPRING AND MATTRESS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1931.

A report on the Bed, Spring and Mattress Industry in Canada for the year 1931 is presented herewith.

Reports were received from sixty establishments which were located by provinces as follows: - Nova Scotia two, New Brunswick two, Quebec thirteen, Ontario thirty-four, Manitoba four, Alberta two. To avoid disclosure of information concerning individual establishments, statistics for the provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick have been combined and are shown throughout this report as "Maritime Provinces". Similar procedure has been adopted in the case of Manitoba and Alberta and these are shown as "Prairie Provinces".

The principal products of the industry in the order of their importance as represented by the total selling value were as follows: - mattresses \$3,085,405, bed springs \$982,705, metal beds \$861,980, metal couches \$332,401, pillows \$219,631, cushions \$185,595, box springs \$101,526. The production of these articles must not be considered as representing their total output in Canada as most of them are also manufactured in furniture and upholstering establishments, etc., and, therefore, cannot be included in this report.

The sixty factories represented a total capital investment of \$6,386,443, the total number of persons employed was 1,626, and their salaries and wages amounted to \$1,985,182. The amount expended for all materials used was \$3,289,883, whilst the selling value of the products was \$6,504,777. The sum of \$3,214,894 represents the value added by the process of manufacture.

Considerable decreases were recorded over the previous year. In the number of establishments 1, capital investment \$1,869,260, employees 108, salaries and wages \$65,461, cost of materials \$821,551, value of products \$1,527,884 and value added by manufacture \$706,333. Detailed statistics of production, materials used, capital, employment, fuel and power consumption, imports and exports will be found in the following tables.

Size of Establishments.

In view of the tendency towards concentration in industrial enterprises a series of tables has been prepared presenting in a threefold way the size of establishments in the Bed, Spring and Mattress Industry in Canada measured by (a) capital investment, (b) gross value of production and (c) the number of persons employed. The movement of capital, production and employment within these groups is also indicated.

In 1931 the total number of plants reporting was sixty with a total capital investment of \$6,386,443, a gross value of production of \$6,504,777 and a total employment of 1,626. Eight establishments had an investment of \$4,459,478, nine a production of \$4,172,704 and three an employment of 578. The average capital invested in the sixty plants was \$106,441 and of the eight plants \$557,435, the average gross value of production in the sixty plants was \$108,413 and in the nine plants \$463,634, whilst in employment the average of the sixty plants was 27 and of the three plants 193.
