ROOFING PAPER AND WALL BOARD

Ottawa, September, 1930. - A report on the manufacture of composition roofing paper, shingles, saturated felts and sheathings and of insulating and construction boards in Canada during the calendar year 1929 has been issued by the Forest Products Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa.

The report deals first with the production of roofing materials and wall boards made principally of paper as reported by the eleven establishments which specialise in its manufacture. These eleven establishments form an industrial group which is treated as a separate industry under the Industrial Census.

There are also a number of establishments which specialize in the production of other commodities and are classed in other industrial groups but which report the production of paper roofing and wall boards as side lines or by-products. There are still other plants manufacturing composition roofing and wallboards made principally of some material other than paper such as flax straw, gypsum, asbestos, etc.

The grand total of the production of all classes of composition roofing, insulating and construction boards as reported by all these different industrial groups is shown in two separate tables in the report.

Of the eleven establishments which form the industry proper, one was located in New Brunswick, three in Quebec, four in Ontario, one in Manitoba and two in British Columbia. Generally speaking these firms purchase felt paper and paper boards from the paper mills and treat these with different water-proofing and fire-resisting preparations to render them more suitable for roofing and insulating purposes.

There was a total of \$7,439,641 invested in the eleven plants which form the industry proper. It gave employment to 207 salaried employees and 343 wage earners comprising 493 males and 57 females. The total payroll amounted to \$945,852. The total cost of materials was \$3,018,273 and the moss talve of production was \$6,111,663 giving as the net value of production or value added by manufacture, \$3,093,390.

In all cases the figures for 1929 show decided increases over those for 1928. The raw materials used are principally paper, felt and paper board. For the further treatment of this material the firms purchase large quantities of tar, asphalt, flux oil and other waterproofing and fire resisting chemicals as well as adhesives and clours. They also purchase a large quantity of mineral surfacing for composition of ings and sidings which consists of magnesite, silicosand, dolomite, crushed slate and other stone, talc, feldspar, marble dust, asbestos and asbestos sand.

The eleven establishments in this group reported the purchase of 18,478 tons of felt and other paper valued at \$1,216,868 and 6,180 tons of paper board valued at \$278,922. They also purchased 278 tons of wrapping paper valued at \$33,869 and \$1,488,614 worth of chemicals, surfacing materials and other supplies.

The products of the industry are composition roofing in rolls, composition simples and slates, saturated felts and sheathings, composition sidings, building paper, and insulating and construction wallboards of all kinds. Roofing is sold by the roll or "square", a square consisting of 108 square feet of material sufficient to cover an area of a hundred square feet of roof with the necessary overlapping. Shingles and slates are usually sold by the square also. Ordinary building paper is sold by the roll which usually contains four squares while saturated felts and sheathings are sold by the ton and wall boards by the square foot.
