THE MISCELLANEOUS PAPER GOODS INDUSTRY
(Paper Goods, n.e.s.)
IN CANADA
1931

Ottawa, December, 1932. - A report on the miscellaneous paper goods industry in Canada for 1931 has been completed by the Forestry Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This report gives the production of all plants in Canada engaged chiefly in the manufacture of coated, waxed and gummed paper; wallpaper, paper patterns, milk bottle caps, and in a general way all products which cannot be classed in any other group of the paper-using industries. There are, however, a number of other firms classified in other industrial groups which make some of these products as a side line to their principal production. The firms dealt with in the present report also manufacture, as secondary products, commodities reported by other industrial groups.

There were 74 firms classed in this industrial group in 1931. Of these 74 plants, 48 were located in Ontario, 23 in Quebec and 2 in Manitoba and 1 in British Columbia.

The total capital investment was \$13,825,055 as against \$13,084,168 in 1930. The value placed on lands, buildings and machinery was \$7,419,652, materials on hand and stocks in process were placed at \$1,298,643, finished products on hand \$1,142,817 and the cash, trading, operating accounts and bills receivable aggregated \$3,963,943. Ontario with \$10,300,406 accounted for 74.5 per cent of the total investment in the industry.

During the year employment was given to 2,387 persons, of which 1,676 were males, 1,283 being wage-earners and 393 paid on a salary basis. Of the 711 females employed 496 were wage-earners and 215 salaried employees. Payment for salaries and wages totalled \$3,139,270 as against \$2,724,450 in 1930.

Electric power totalled \$73,627 which represented the cost of 4,116,896 k.w.h. Six steam engines, a total of 821 electric motors rated at 4,424 h.p. and 31 boilers were installed in the various plants.

Cost of fuel aggregated \$95,739 as against \$98,877 in 1930. There were used 12,596 tons of bituminous coal valued at \$72,652; 271 tons of anthracite, at \$2,545; 1 ton of lignite coal imported at \$11; 29 tons of coke, at \$287; 100 gallons of gasoline at \$25; 239,653 gallons of fuel oil, at \$16,737; 4 cords of wood at \$85; 3,956 M cu. ft. of manufactured gas, at \$3,440, and 107 M cu. ft. of natural gas at \$32.

The raw materials of the industry amounted to \$5,463,651 in 1931 as against \$5,787,150 in the previous year. Newsprint paper cost \$232,872; book and writing paper, \$884,378; wrapping paper \$556,670; paper board, \$378,757; all other paper \$1,739,971; envelopes \$44,954; and all other materials \$1,490,585 and containers and other packing materials \$135,464.

The total value of all products in 1931 aggregated \$12,101,568 as against \$12,538,497 in 1930. Waxed paper was valued at \$2,066,120; coated paper at \$1,401,312; greeting cards, \$451,739; gummed paper, \$443,702; vegetable parchment, \$430,906; calendars, \$418,776; window displays, \$337,036; milk bottle caps, \$257,036; decalcomania transfers, \$195,301; counter check books, \$185,909; and price tags, pin tickets and garment marking tags \$169,418; all other products \$5,727,057 and custom work \$17,256.




