## THE LITHOGRAPHING INDUSTRY, 1930 - 1931.

Ottawa, December, 1932. A report on the lithographing industry in Canada for 1930 and 1931 has just been issued by the Forestry Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

This report gives the production of all firms specializing in this printing process and covers the greater part of such work produced in Canada during 1931. There are, however, a number of firms classified in other industrial groups which do lithographing as a side line to their principal product.

There were 43 firms engaged primarily in lithographing in 1931 as compared to 46 in 1930. The distribution by provinces was as follows: Ontario, 29; Quebec, 8; British Columbia, 3; Manitoba, 2; and Nova Scotia, 1,

Capital invested in this industry decreased from \$17,111,128 in 1930 to \$15,367,519 in 1931. Lands, buildings, machinery, tools and other equipment were valued at \$11,001,630; materials and stocks in process totalled \$1,205,794; finished products on hand, \$650,257; and the value of cash, trading and operating accounts was \$2,509,838.

The average number of employees was 2,965 in 1931 as compared to 3,211 in 1930. Of this total 595 were salaried employees and 2,370 wage earners. The total payment for salaries and wages amounted to \$4,257,511 as compared with \$4,701,389 in 1931.

Expenditures for fuel at \$40,499 showed a decrease of \$4,610 from the figure for 1930. The total value of electricity purchased in this industry was \$51,541 which represented the cost of 2,264,997 K.W.H. Power equipment consisted of 877 electric motors with a total rating of 4,321 H.P.

The purchase of materials amounted to \$4,324,182 in 1931 as against \$5,540,702 in 1930 and the total gross value of products in 1931 was given at \$11,135,421 of which \$6,813,387 represented lithographing; \$1,534,468, job printing; \$526,507, calendars; \$136,903, bookbinding; \$94,883, advertising; \$55,903, tags, seals and greeting cards; \$17,934, embossing; \$13,355, engraving, n.e.s.; \$5,227, stationery goods of all kinds, and \$1,936,854 all other products and work done including photo engraving, stereotyping, electrotyping, ruling, loose-leaf and blank books, playing cards and counter check books,

The following tables give a summary of the principal statistics in 1930 and 1931 covering the distribution of establishments, materials employed, products manufactured, capital employed, employment, fuel and power.
