THE STATIONERY AND ENVELOPE INDUSTRY

IN CANADA

1928-1929

Ottawa, October, 1930. - A report on the stationery and envelope industry in Canada for 1928 and 1929 has been completed by the Forest Products Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. Statistics concerning this industry were in the past included in the report on miscellaneous paper products industries. This report gives the production of firms specializing in the manufacture of envelopes, tablets, papeteries and other stationers' supplies and covers the greater part of the production of these commodities in Canada. There are, however, a number of other firms classified in other industrial groups which make stationery goods as a side line to their principal production. The firms dealt with in the present report also manufacture commodities other than stationery goods as secondary products.

There were 34 firms producing stationery supplies in Canada in 1929 compared to 31 in 1928. Of these 19 were located in Ontario, 5 each in Quebec and Manitoba, 4 in British Columbia and 1 in Saskatchewan. Capital invested increased 7.3 p.c. in 1929 to \$5,179,903: total number of employees 9 p.c. to 1,496: and salaries and wages 6.2 p.c. to \$1,644,985. Increases were also reported in the cost of materials used, from \$3,960,550 to \$4,111,459 and in gross value of products, from \$6,660,876 to \$7,014,573.

Out of a total of \$5,179,903 capital employed in 1929, \$2,508,991 was invested in land, buildings and fixtures, \$1,427,783 in materials and stocks on hand and \$1,143,129 in cash, accounts and other working capital.

There were 1,496 persons employed in the stationery and envelope industry in 1929, of which 654 were males, 436 being wage-earners and 218 paid on a salary basis. Of the 342 females employed 745 were wage-earners and 97 salaried employees.


Expenditures in electric power during 1929 amounted to \$20,132. Metered power totalled 922,598 k.w.h. valued at \$15,556 and the power purchased at a flat rate amounted to 121 h.p. valued at \$3,476. This power was used to operate 421 electric motors rated at 1,027 h.p.

Cost of fuel aggregated \$15,889 as against \$13,926 in 1928. There were used 1,019 tons of Canadian bituminous coal valued at \$6,788; 378 tons of anthracite, at \$3,969; 30,356 gallons of fuel oil, at \$2,857; 39 tons of coke, at \$1,003; 804 M cu. ft. of manufactured gas, at \$819; and other fuels, including wood and gasoline, amounting to \$453.

The raw materials of the industry amounted to \$4,111,459 in 1929 as against \$3,360,550 in the previous year. Book and writing paper amounting to 10,396,022 pounds and 5,800 reams valued at \$2,295,279 was the principal item. Newsprint valued at \$43,350, wrapping paper, at \$29,852 and other paper valued at \$439,402 was also used. Other materials cost \$939,085.

Production in 1929 was valued at \$7,014,573. Envelopes made up 39 p.c. of the total value and were produced to the number of 1,313,782 M valued at \$2,732,377. Scribblers, memo, exercise and note books totalled \$958,529; tablets, \$639,754; papeteries, \$564,760; greeting cards,\$283,547; printing, \$174,151; loose-leaf and blank books, \$172,794; filing supplies, \$168,430; and all other stationery products and work dome amounted to \$1,310,221 during the year.

The following tables give, first, a summary of the principal statistics of the industry in 1928 and 1929 followed by comparative detailed tables for both years covering the distribution of establishments, materials employed, products manufactured, capital employed, employment, fuel and power.






