cttawa，October，1930．－A revort on the stationery and envelope industrij in Canada Fior 1928 and 1320 has veen completed by the Forest Products Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics．Statistics concerminc tinis industry were in tine past included in the report on miscellaneous paper products industries．Mhis report gives the production of firms specializing in the maiufacture of envelopes，tablets， papeteries and otier stationers＇supplies and covers the greater part of the production of these commodities in Canada．There are，howover，a number of other firms clessifiled in otier inưustrial sroups winch make stationery goods as a side line to their ？lincipal production．The ijims dealt with in the present renort also manufacture commodities otaer timan stationery goods as seconiary products．

There were 34 Fiums prodacing stationem suonlies in Canada in 1229 comnared to 31 in 1928．Of these 10 were located in Ontario， 5 each in quebec and Manitoba， 4 in znitish Columbia and 1 in Saskatchewan．Capital invested increased 7.3 p．c．in 1029 to $\$ 5,173,003$ ：total number of emplorees 9 p．c．to 1,496 ：and salaries and wages $6.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$ ． to $\$ 1,644,985$ ．Increases were also reported in the cost of materials used，from $\$ 3,950,550$ to $\$ 4,111,459$ and in gross value of products，from $\$ 6,660,876$ to $\$ 7,014,573$ ．

Ont of a total of $\$ 5,179,903$ canital employed in $1929, \$ 2,508,991$ was invested in land，buildins and fixtures，$\$ 1,427,7 \varepsilon 3$ in meterials and stocks on hand and B1，143，129 in cash，accounts and otie：roring capital．

There were 1,496 persons employed in tie stitionery and envelone industry in 1929，oi whici 654 were males， 435 being wage－eamers and 218 paid on a salarr basis． Of tie blen females mployed 745 were wase－earners and 37 baliriea employees．

Expenditures in electiic power during 129 amountec to $\$ 20,132$ ．Metered pover totalled $922,598 \mathrm{k} . w . \mathrm{s}$ ．valua at $\$ 15,555$ and tie power purchased at a flat rate
 motors rated at 1,027 1．p．

Cost of fuel asgregated $\$ 15,8 \% 9$ as against 313,926 in 1328 ．There were ased 1,019 tons of Canadian bituminous coal valued at $\$ 5,738 ; 378$ tons of anthracite，at $\$ 3,969$ ； 30,356 gallons of fiel oil，at $\$ 2,857$ ； 29 tons of colve，at $\$ 1,003$ ； 804 亿 cu．さtt． of manufactired gas，at $\$ 819$ ；and other fuels，including wood and gasoline，arnounting to $\mathbf{b}^{\prime}+53$ ．

The raw materials oi tiee industry amounted to $\$ 4,111,459$ in 1929 as against $\$ 3,350,550$ in the previous jear．Jook and writing paper arountins to $10,336,022$ pounds and 5,800 reams valued at $32,295,279$ was the principal item．Tew sprint valued at $\$ 43,350$ ，wraphine paper，at $\$ 29,852$ and other paper velued $2 t \$ 439,402$ was also uced． Ctier miterials cost $\$ 939,085$ ．

Production in 1029 was valued at $\$ 7,014,573$ ．Envelopes made up 39 p．c．of the total value and were producê to the number of $1,313,782 \mathrm{M}$ valued at $\$ 2,732,377$ ． Scribblers，memo，exercise and note books totalled $\$ 058,529$ ；tablets，$\$ 639,754$ ； papeteries，$\$ 564,760$ ；sreetinf cards，$\$ 283,547$ ；orintins，$\$ 174,151$ ；loose－leaf and blank books，$\$ 172,794$ ；filing supplies，$\$ 168,430$ ；and all otiel stationery opoducts and work done amounted to $\$ 1,310,221$ during the year．
