The Dominion Bureau of Statistics index number of wholesale prices on the base 1926-100 fell fractionally from 71.0 for the week onded May 18 to 70.7 is the following weak.

Vagetable Products droppod from 64.8 to 63.8 , lomor pricos for barley, com, augar, ram rubbor and potatoos, influoncing tho indox moro thar silghtiy higher quotations for whoat, oats, bran and shorts. Animal and Thoir Prodtcts roso from 65.2 to 65.5 gains for stcors, hogs, lambs, hidos, oggs and fresh and curod moats, outweighing lossos for calves and buttor. Tibres, Textiles, and Textile Products advanced from 74.1 to 74.4 , higher prices for artificial silk hosiery more than counterbalancing reduced prices for raw silk, raw wool and worsted cloth yarns. Mood, Tood Products and Paper moved down from 65.9 to 65.8 owing chiofly to prico roductions for fir flooring. Iron and Its Products advancod from 87.4 to 87.5 due largely to higher quotations for shovels. Non-Forrous Motals and Thoir Products wore unchanged at 64.5 minor losses for coppor and tin balancing gains for silver. Nom-Metallic Minerals and Thoir Products and Chemicals and Allied Products at 85.5 and 81.9 respectively wer the ame as in the previous woat.
