The Dominion Bureau of Statistics index number of wholesale prices on the base 1926 er 100 , advancod fractionally from 71.7 for the weok ondod Juno 8 to 71.9 for the wook of Jume 15.

Vegotable Products mountod from 66.5 to 67.4 , highor pricos for grains, brea, shorts, and orangos, boing of moro consoquonco than declines for vogotablo ofls, rollod oats, and cannod fruits. Animals and Thoir Products foll from 66.5 to 66.3 , furthor reductions in livostock pricos ovorbalancing minor increasos for leathor. Fibros, Textiles and Taxtilo Products changod from 74.5 to 74.6 , with raw cotton firmor and silk fabrics slightly lower. Iron and Its Products were unchanged at 87.5 , whilo Food, Mood Products and Paper foll from 66.1 to 66.0 . Non-Ferrous Metals and Their Products dropped from 64.3 to 64.0 with copper, lead, and zinc lowor than a wook ago. Non-Motallic Minerals rose from 85.5 to 85.6 influenced by higher coal quotations. Chemicais and Allied Products remained the same at 82.1 .

Canadian Fam Products were unchanged at 59.1, with higher grain prices offset by reductions for Iive stock.
