WHMKIY INDHX NUABERS OF WHOLMSATE PRICBS, 1934.
(1926=100)
The Dominion Bureau of Statistics index number of wholesale prices on the base $1926=100$ moved down from 72.3 for the week ended July 20 to 72.2 for the week ended July 27. Slight gains wero recorded for grains, cured meats, butter, raw wool and lead while livestock, fresh meats, eggs and copper declined.

Vegetable Products were unchanged at 69.2 minor advances for grains, bran and shorts, offecting losses for rubber, hay and potatoes. Animals and Their Products fell from 66.3 to 65.8 , lower quotations for livestock, hides, fresh meats and eggs influencing the index more than higher prices for cured meats and butter. Fibres, Textiles and Textile Products, Iron and Its Products, and Non-Metalic Minerale and. Thoir Products were unchanged at $73.6,87.1$, and 85.9 respectively. Chiefly becauso of lower prices for spruce scantling, Wood, Tood Products and Paper moved dow from 65.9 to 65.8. Non-Ferrous Motals and Their Products docined from 63.1 to 62.8, owing principally to casier prices for coppor, silver and zinc. Chemicals and dilied Products changod from 82.0 to 81.9 due largely to reductions in the price of gray acetatc of lime.

Canadian Farm Products wore 60.5 for the woek ended July 27 as compared with 60.9 for the previous week. Slightly higher prices for grains were insuificiont to offect lower quotations for hay, straw and potatoes, and the indox for the field products group moved down from 59.1 to 58.9. Reduced prices for livestock and eggs were chiefly responsible for the drop in the animal group from 64.0 to 63.2 .
