## WEEKLY TNDEX NUNBERS OF WHOTESALE PRICES, 1935-1936 <br> ( $3.926=1.00$ )

The Dominion Bureau of ittatistics index number of wholesale prices, on the base $1926=200$ : rose frora 72.2 tio 72.3 during the $\pi$ edk ending April 24. Price changes of inportance were confined chiofly to the Vegetabie, Animal and Non-Ferrous groups. potatoes, which of late have been ciutracting considerable attention, made a further advance of nearly $7.0 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}_{\mathrm{c}}$, and Erains averaged higher for the week. Livestock prices, however, were slightly Lower despije export shipments approximating the record for the

Vegetable Frodusts mounted from 66.6 to 67.3. Coffeo quotations displazed a weoker tendency but grains, milled products. raw sugar and potatocs were firmer. Tho potato index now stands at 72.5 as compared with 25.6 for the corresponding week of last year. Animal Producte dulined from 69. 8 to 68.8. Egg supplies are still below nomal for the scason and prices were buoyant. Fresh meats advanced, also, but reducticns were reported for hicus, iivestock, cured meats, milk products and fatr. Raw silk again dropped sharpiy, making the fourth successive week of decline, and raw wool and worsted cloth varns sagged, as well, but an increase in ram cotton was sufficient to counteract these losses and Textilos romained at 69.5. Advances in copper and silver changed the index for Nor Ferrous Mevels from 68.8 to 69.0 , but Wood, Iron, Non-Metallic Minerals ane Chemicals were unchaged at $68.0,87.4 .85 .5$ and 77.4 respectively.

Canadian Farm Produets rose from 65,2 to 65.4. Field Products mounted from 60.0 to 60.5 chiefly because of an Ancrease in potatoes, while Animal Products fell from 73.9 to 73.5 when decreases in iivestocit, hices and wool outweighed an advance in eggs.
