## WMEKIY IIDPX NOMBERS OF WHOLDSALE ERTCBS, 1939 1940

The upward inovernent, in Industris. material prices continued during the week ending May 77, and the Dominion Buicau of Statistics indef, on the base August 1939=100, rose from 122.2 for the weak cine May 10 to $12 \varepsilon_{0} 8$. Food Materials fell from 132.6 to 128.0, as a sharp decline in grains ouiveiged an increase in steers, but Manufacturing Materials advanced from $1 ? 7.5$ to 130.4 , when lowe: quotations for linseed oil and tin failed to offset higher prices for rubber, cottonseed 011, rosin and raw silk. The Stable group remained at 11...8.

General Wholesale Comudities, on the other hand, moved still lower, dropping from 82.8 to 81.9. Declines predoninatod in vegetable frcaucts, Animals, Textiles and Chomicals. Wood and Non-Metailic ifinevals were buoyant, Among the more important commodifies to weaken were grinning meats: butter, eggs ant raw cotton, while higher prices ruled for bakery products, was rubber, livestock, ian silk, coal and British columbia fir.
