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## WEEKLY INDEX NUMBERS OF WHOLESALE FRICES, 1939-1940

Continuing the advance of the previous two weeks, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics' index of Industrial Material prices, on the base August 1939=100, rose from 120.3 for the week of June 7 to 121.9 for the week of June 14. Both Manufacturing and Food Materials moved higher, the former rising from 124.1 to 127.7, as firmer prices ruled for rubber, cotton, silk and tin ingets, while Food Materials changed from 128.9 to 129.8, when an increase in steers sutweighed a reduction in wheat. The Stable group was unchanged at 112.9.

General Wholesale Commodities, on the contrary, were slightly easier, declining from 81.9 for the week of June 7 to 81.2 for the week of June 14. Vegetable Products moved lower, but Animal Products, Textiles and Non Ferrous Metals advanced. Grains were weak and flour, vegetable oils and lard moved down as well, while livestock, fresh meats, raw cotton and tin ingots were emong those commodities to advance.

Canadian Farm Products fell from 65.7 to 65.5. Grains were mainly responsible for lowering the index of Field Products from 54.6 to 53.9. Animal Products rose from 84.4 to 84.8 when increases in livestock and hides proved of more importance than a decline in eggs.
