Continuing the advance of the provious two wocks, the Dominion Buroau of Statistics! indox of industiel Metericl pricus, on the base August 1939 100 , rose from 120.3 for tho mook of Juno? to 221.9 Dor the woek of Juic 14. Both Manufactaring and Food Natorinls movad highor, the formos zising from 124 ol to 127.7 , as firmer pricos rulod for rubber, coiton, silk ail? tin ingots, whil. Fooi Materials changed from 128.9 to 129.8 , when an increaso in sjeers wtevisied :coducition ti: whua $\hat{y}$, The Stable group was unchanged at 112.9.

Gonoral Tholesino Cumoditios, of the ontraij, were slightly easier, doclining from 81.9 for the week of tune 7 : 8 ?. . for the vock of June 14 . Vegetable Products moved lower, but Aninal Pruuucts, Texisios ani. No: Tisrous Metals advanced. Grains were weak and flour, vogotablo uils and lard movod jown ts woll, whilo livestock, fresh meate, ram cotton and in ingots roso ariong thoso sownoditios to advanco.

Canadian Farm produets feil. from 65.7 io 65.5 . Grains were mainly responsible for lowering the index of Field Products from 54.6 to 53.9 . Animal Products rose from 84.4 to 84.8 whon increases in 11vostock and hides proved of more importanco than a decline in oggs.
