WHEKLY INDEX NUMBRRS OF THOLLSALE ERICES, 1939-1940
Revorsing the movomont of the previous three weeks, the Dominion Bureau of Statistical indox of Industrial Material prices on the base August $1939=100$ docinned from 121.9 to 120.2 botwoon the woeks ended Juno 14 and 21 . The stable price group was unchargod ai 112.9 but the sonsitivo group foll from 128.3 to 125.4. Both tho manufacturing and focd sub-groups were lower. Reductions in prices of tid and hemp were instrumental in depressing manufacturing materiale from 127.7 to 124.7 . Food materials moved down from 129.8 to 127.0 , Iower quotations for wheat and steers outweighing gains for hogs.

The Burear? ${ }^{\text {g }}$ goneral wholesale price index eased still lower in the week of June 21 and the index on the base 1926 w 100 fell from 81.8 to 81.5 . Animal producta led the cecline with a drop of more than 1 p.c. Vegetable producta also moved down abcut 1 p.c. and amaller losses occurred in the nop-ferrous metal group. Wood products, iroz and atcol and chemtcals woro s?ightly higher than in the previous month while fibros and non-motallics remained unchanged.

Canadian Farm Products dropped from 65.5 to 63.8. Lower prices for grain and hay reduced the vegetable products index from 53.9 to 52.1. Animal products decined from 84.8 to 83.5 is recessions in livestock and egg markets outweighod gains for hidos and $\hat{\text { sins. }}$
