WEEKLY INDEX NUMBERS OF WHOLESALE PRICES, 1939-1940.

Industrial Material prices were moderately firmer, and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics: index, on the base August 1939=100, rose from 121.4 for the week ending September 13 to 122.0 for the week ending September 20. The Stable price group remained at 117.6, but the Sensitive price group, including Manufacturing and Food Materials, advanced from 124.1 to 125.0. Manufacturing Materials rose from 121.5 to 123.3, as increases in hides and raw cotton proved moro important than reductions in raw rubber and raw silk, but Food Materials fell from 131.0 to 129.6, due to declines in wheat, steers and hogs.

The General Wholesale Index remained at 33.0. Vegetable Products moved lower, and Non-Ferrous Metals were unchanged, while small increases were shown by the remaining six groups.

Canadian Farm Products fell from 64.4 to 64.1. Field Products dropped from 51.4 to 50.8, because of decreases in grains, potatoes, onions and hay, but Animal Products rose from 86.1 to 86.3, when advances in hides, milk and eggs outweighed a decline in livestock.
