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## WEEKLY INDEX NUMBERS OF WHOLESALE PRICES, 1940-1941

Reacting slightly after a steady advance of ten weeks, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics index of 567 commodities (1926=100) declined from 93.7 for the week ending October 10 to 93.6 for the week ending October 17th. Price movements were mixed, and in the eight major groups comprising the index increases were shown for Textiles, Wood, Non-Metallic Minerals and Chemicals, while Vegetable Products and Animal Products moved lower. Among the more important commodities to advance were hay, potatoes, cotton fabrics, fish, milk, coal and hogs, whereas reductions occurred in wheat, oats, butter, raw cotton, steers, fresh meats, flour and milled products.

Industrial Material Prices, on the base August 1939=100, fell from 141.4 to 140.7. Stable Materials remained at 124.7, but the Sensitive price series, including Manufacturing and Food Materials, dropped from 153.8 to 152.6. Lower prices for raw rubber and raw cotton depressed the former from 153.8 to 153.1, while Food Materials receded from 153.6 to 150.8, on general weakness in grains and livestock.

Canadian Farm Products declined from 74.4 to 73.7. Easier quotations for grains outweighed advances in potatoes, onions and hay to change the index for Field Products from 59.2 to 57.7. Arimal Products rose from 99.9 to 100.4, as an increase in milk proved of more importance than declines in hivestock and eggs.
