## WEEKKY INDEX NUMBERS OF WHOLESALE PRICES, 1940-1941 <br> the

In the week ending October 24th/Dominion Bureau of Statistics inder of wholesale comodity prices, on the base $1926=100$, rose from 93.6 to 93.7 , recovering the loss of the previous week. Moderate increases occursed in Animal Products, Textiles, Iron, Non-Metallic Minerals and Chemicals, while Wood Products moved lower and Vegetable Products and Non-Ferrous Metals were unchanged. Among the more important commodities to advence were potatoes, rubber and its products, boots and shoes, hogs, eggs, woollen, worsted cloth yarns, hardware and soap, whereas lower quotations ruled for graing, steers, fresh meats, raw cotton and cedar shingles.

Induetrial materiel prices eased seactionally during the week under review, the composite index for 30 commodities recording a decine of 0.3 to 140.4 (August, 1939. 100). Lower grain prices in the food sub-section coupled with lesscr decreases in the menufacturing series ware responsible for the decrease, the stable group of 12 commoditios being unchanged at 124.7.

The Canadian Farm Produots wholesale prices index held unchanged for the week ended October 24 th at an index level of 73.7. Field products declined 0.6 to 57.1 due to lower grain prices, while an advance of 1.1 to 101.5 in the animal products section reflected sharply higher egg prices coupled with a small advance for hides and okins.
