Wholesal. commodity prices continued to mont during the wook ending june 20, and tho Dominion Bureail of Siatistics inder, on the bess 1926a100, advancod from 89.3 for the weok ending Juno 13 to 89.8 .for the weok ending June 20 . Incroases occurrod in all but ino of the ofght major groups comprising the inder, while Non-Forrous Motals and Non-Metallic Minozia Tise unchangua. Some of the more outstanding commoditios to move higher were grains, yotatoes; livestock, meats, corton, wool and furniture, but raw rubber and gramerffee soce minined.

Industrial Matorial pricos, on the baso August 1939 m 100 , rose from 134.9 to 135.3. The Stablo group was unchanged at 124.5 , but the Sensitive price series, includIng Manufacturing and Food Matorials, mounted from $14 \tilde{e}_{0} 4$ to 143.0 . Manufacturing Materials incroasod f=0ia 141.7 io 242.1 , when reducifons in raw rubber and Manila hemp proved of less impurtance than advances in raw cotton, reif sijis ajd in ingots. Food Matorials rose from 244.0 to 245.2 , influenced mainiy by highor quotations for wheat, oats and hogs.

Canadian Farm products were fism, moving from 71.0 to 71.1 . Field Products rose from 56.8 to 57.1 , as higher prices ruled for grains and hay, but Animal Products declinod from 94.9 to 94.6 , as a recuction in hides and skins outweighed advances in livestock, aggs and wool.
