WEIGHTED INDEX NUMBERS OF 17 MINING STOCKS

1926 - 100

The weighted index of seventeen mining stocks computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base 1926=100, was 110.1 for the week ending December 13th, as compared with 118.4 for the week ending December 6th.

Gold copper stocks, represented by Amulet and Noranda, fell from 326.3 to 290.0. Eleven gold stocks fell from 78.6 to 75.5. Four silver and miscellaneous stocks fell from 74.2 to 71.3.

Among the gold stocks the average weekly prices behaved as follows:Coniaurum fell from \$1.60 to \$1.20, McIntyre from \$21.44 to \$20.52, Lake Shore from \$17.74 to \$16.72, Teck-Hughes from \$8.44 to \$8.06 and Wright-Hargreaves from \$2.02 to \$1.60.

Average prices were lower for both of the gold copper stocks. Amulet fell from \$2.99 to \$2.78 and Noranda from \$62.48 to \$55.42.

In the silver and miscellaneous group the average price of Beaver fell from 74ϕ to 67ϕ , Coniagas from \$2.38 to \$1.89 and Mining Corporation from \$3.96 to \$3.54.
