## WEIGHTED INDEX NUMBERS OF 17 MINING STOCKS

(Issued June 28th, 1928)

1926 = 100

The weighted index of seventeen mining stocks computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base of 1926 = 100 was 126.3 for the week ending June 28th, as compared with 126.7 for the week ending June 21st.

Gold copper stocks represented by Noranda and Amulet rose from 204.5 to 215.1. Eleven gold stocks fell from 113.1 to 110.6. Four silver and miscellaneous stocks fell from 89.4 to 86.5.

Among the gold stocks the average weekly prices behaved as follows:Hollinger fell from \$14.18 to \$13.79, Coniarma from \$4.70 to \$4.44, McIntyre
from \$26.14 to \$25.77, Dome from \$8.60 to \$8.36, Kirkland Lake from \$1.82 to
\$1.64, Lake Shore from \$23.25 to \$22.98 and Sylvanite from \$3.03 to \$2.55,
Teck-Hughes rose from \$10.69 to \$10.79.

Average prices were higher for one of the gold copper stocks and lower for one. Noranda rose from \$36.21 to \$38.60 and Amulet fell from \$3.89 to \$3.71.

In the silver and miscellaneous group the average price of Nipissing fell from \$3.94 to \$3.78 and Beaver from \$1.31 to \$1.11. Mining Corporation rose from \$3.26 to \$3.29.
