## WEIGHTED INDEX NUMBERS OF 17 MINING STOCKS

1926 - 100

The weighted index of seventeen mining stocks computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base of 1926 = 100 was 130.4 for the week ending July 26th, as compared with 130.8 for the week ending July 19th.

Gold copper stocks represented by Noranda and Amulet rose from 288.6 to 309.6. Eleven gold stocks fell from 101.1 to 96.4. Four silver and miscellaneous stocks fell from 86.0 to 83.9.

Among the gold stocks the average weekly prices behaved as follows: Premier rose from \$2.26 to \$2.29. Dome fell from \$8.29 to \$8.23, Hollinger from \$12.13 to \$11.25, McIntyre from \$22.76 to \$22.30, Lake Shore from \$22.24 to \$21.67, Teck-Hughes from \$10.18 to \$9.58 and Wright-Hargreaves from \$3.34 to \$3.13.

Average prices were higher for one of the gold copper stocks and lower for the other. Noranda rose from \$52.34 to \$56.95, while Amulet fell from \$4.59 to \$4.35.

In the silver and miscellaneous group the average price of Nipissing fell from \$3.59 to \$3.49 and Mining Corporation from \$3.54 to \$3.42.
