WEIGHTED INDEX NUMBERS OF 17 MINING STOCKS

1926 = 100

The weighted index number of seventeen mining stocks computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base 1926=100 was 76.6 for the week ending May 15th, as compared with 74.3 for the previous week.

Eleven gold stocks rose from 64.0 to 64.4. Gold copper stocks represented by Amulet and Noranda rose from 133.9 to 146.8. Four silver and miscellaneous stocks were unchanged (35.7).

Among the gold stocks, the weekly average prices behaved as follows:Dome rose from \$8.36 to \$8.66, Hollinger from \$6.40 to \$6.42, McIntyre from \$18.34
to \$18.47, Vipond Consolidated from \$1.02 to \$1.08, Teck-Hughes from \$6.61 to \$6.82 and
Wright-Hargreaves from \$1.92 to \$1.94. Premier fell from 95¢ to 85¢ and Lake Shore
from \$22.48 to \$22.40.

Average weekly prices were higher for both of the gold copper stocks. Amulet rose from 75ϕ to 86ϕ and Noranda from \$26.71 to \$29.25.

In the silver and miscellaneous group, Nipissing rose from \$1.47 to \$1.50. Mining Corporation fell from \$1.63 to \$1.61.
