2leven gold stocks fell from 51.3 to 50.7, four gold-copper stocks from 55.3 to 53.9, and five silver and miscellancous stocks from 18.2 to 16.3.

Among the gold stocks the weekl average prices bohaved as follows:Tirkiend Like declined from $35 \phi$ to $31 申$, Lalre Shore from $\$ 26.49$ to $\$ 26.32$, UcIntrue from $\$ 16.12$ to $\$ 15.90$ and Tcek-Hughes from $\$ 3.83$ to $\$ 3.49$. Dome rose from $\$ 9.57$ to $\$ 9.87$ and Eollinger from $\$ 4.60$ to $\$ 4.72$.

Avcrage wockly pricos twere lower, for three and unchanged for one of the sold-copper stocks. Hudson Bay dropped from $\$ 1.74$ to $\$ 1.64$, Noranda from $\$ 16.06$ to $\$ 15.48$ and Sherritt-Gordon from $36 \phi$ to $32 \phi$.

In the silver and miscellaneous group, Mining Corporation fell from 84 to 99 and Mipissing from $75 \phi$ to 666 .
