## WEIGETED ITDEX NUIBERS OF 20 NINING STOCES

 $19 \hat{C}=100$The weighted index numbers of twenty mining stocks computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base $1926=100$, ras 60.7 for the meek ending September 15th, as compared witi 62.5 for the provious meel:.

Eleven gold stocks fell from 56.7 to 56.3, four gold-copoer stocks from 87.1 to 80.4 , and five silver and miscollancous stocks from 29.8 to 28.6 .

Among the gold stocks woeklr average pricos behaved as followw:Eollincer declined from $\$ 5.52$ to $\$ 5.40$, MeIntyre from $\$ 18.75$ to $\$ 18.34$, Teck-Hughes from $\$ 3.48$ to $\$ 3.35$ and Vipond Consolidated from $35 \phi$ to $31 \phi$. Lake Shore mounted from $\$ 28.29$ to $\$ 28.35$ and Wrisint-Hareraves from $\$ 2.87$ to $\$ 2.97$.

Averace wockly prices were lomor for all of tho gold-copper stocks. Amilet fell from $27 \phi$ to $25 \phi$, Zudson Bay from $\$ 4.81$ to $\$ 4.22$, Noranda from $\$ 22.28$ to $\$ 20.89$ and Shorritt-Gordon from $54 \phi$ to 594 .

In the silver and misccllaneous Eroup, iGininc Comoration fell from \$1. 76 to $\$ 1.53$ and $W$ Tipissing from $\$ 1.32$ to $\$ 1.30$ while Coniagas rose from $\$ 1.00$ to $\$ 1.05$.
