

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This is the second report compiled by the Bureau of Statistics on the Marchousing industry, the first being in 1944. The survey for 1945 was more comprehensive than in 1944, but it is still not up to the standard that should be reached.

Ten companies reporting in 1944 and having a total revenue of \$882,082 did not report in 1945. Some of the companies went out of business and others changed hands and the new owners did not have the required information, and eighteen companies that did not report in 1944, but were operating, submitted schedules for 1945. Their total revenue for the year amounted to \$1,347,335. Consequently, the number of companies reporting shows an increase of ten over the preceding year.

Association who were doing a public warehouse business during the year. Cooperatives operating warehouses for their members were not included, nor were packing houses and other businesses operating storage facilities in connection with their respective businesses. Many warehousing companies also operated a local moving and cartage business and others operated a motor carrier business, including long distance moving. For some of them the revenue from the carrier business was a relatively large part of the total revenue and would be more properly classed as motor carriers rather than warehouse companies; the tables show the revenue from each activity. The item "Other Revenues" contains some revenue from merchandising. Again in 1945 the data for companies in the three Maritime Provinces are grouped because of the small number reporting from each province.

The total revenue for the year reported by all respondents was \$15,463,878, an increase of \$920,523 over 1944. Of the total \$7,221,532 or 46.7 per cent was derived from storage, \$1,060,844 or 6.9 per cent from handling and extra labour services, \$1,484,194 or 9.6 per cent from miscellaneous sources, and the remaining \$5,697,308 or 36.3 per cent was derived from cartage, moving and office rentals.

Operating expenses amounted to \$13,505,109 of which \$4,732,585 or 34.04 per cent was for wages and bonuses to warehousemen, drivers and helpers. After deducting interest, income tax, etc., the net income was \$1,015,894 as against \$1,238,897 for 1944. The net occupiable space for household goods was 1,998,735 square feet or 37.7 per cent of the total dry storage space. The cold storage space amounted to 12,938,004 cubic feet. The companies were requested to report the percentage of the space occupied each month in percentages of the total. These were converted into space and percentages computed for the totals. There is still evidence that a number of companies reported approximate figures only, and thus, these data should be used with contion.

The companies operated 961 trucks, only 7 of which were over 6 ton capacity, but of the 137 semitrailer units 77 were over 6 ton capacity.

There was an increase in employment of 619 over the average for 1944 giving a total of 3,451 for the year which figure was comparatively steady for the twelve months. The casual employees fluctuated from 533 in January to 1,076 in September and the average for the year was 827. The total wages amounted to \$4,972,531 and salaries to \$1,723,474, or a total pay roll of \$6,696,005.

Accidents in which vehicles of these companies were involved resulted in injuries to 82 drivers and helpers, 15 other employees, 3 pedestrians and 5 other persons. This is a slight increase over the 1944 figures. However, while there were three fatalities in 1944 there were none in 1945.
