The number of companies reporting for 1949 inproved to 155 compered $w 1$ th 141 in 1948 and 129 for 1947 . The trade association of the industry has been most cooperative in encouraging members to file reports promptiy but late returng still delay publication on more current basis. Statistics given reveal quito comprehenaive analgais of operstions by reglons covering reventes, expenses, det income, employmant, selaries and wages, space, occupency, etc. The Naritiee Provinces have been grouped to prevent revealing individul returris. No reports were received frote *-wforndiand.

The current editian Includes roturns from both mambers and non-members of the Camadian Warahousemen's Association who wer dolng a public warehousing business during the yesr. Cooperatives opartatigg warehouses for their Wenbrs wore not included nor were packing houses and other fires opersting ftorage facilitios in comection with theis respectlve butinesses. Meny warehousing compariss also operated a local moving end cartige bervice and others operated a motor cariier business, including long distance moving. for some firm the revemue from the carrior busiaess represented large part of thoir total revenue and they should bo more properly ciassed as wotor carriers rather than as marehouse companies; however, the following tables thow the revenue from each activity. The itam "Other Revenusal containg sone income from nerchandising.

Fith the increased number of firme reporting, the totrl gross cepital investment advanced from $\$ 30,572,229$ In 1948 to $\$ 35,554,799$ and the avarage per company was thws $\$ 216,824$ in 1948 and rose to 1229 , 386 ia the year under raview. The accrued depreclation vas $\$ 11,673,605$, up frore $\$ 10,551,781$ ome year oarlier. As shown in Table 1 , oparathg rewanues grossed $\$ 20,003,675$ for the Fess compared with $18,838,195$ in 1948 . Most acceunts advunced but storege revanus fram househald goods deckined.

Operating axpenses edpanced more rapidly then revenues to reach $\$ 17,182,216$ ageinst $615,559,685$ in 1948 . The
 revision in warchousing charges to the public was likely to weet rising costs. Although income tax was reduced, interest and other charges were heavier than in 1948 and the net income transierred to surplus was reduced 150 m (29,224,027 in 1948 to \$1,722,195 desplte the increase of 14 in the number of firms reporting.

Revenues from storage contributed $49 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of sperating revenues and cartage and moving $28 . \mathrm{E}$ p.c. Wagea and bomusas represented $56.2 \mathrm{~F} . \mathrm{C}$. of operating expenees while administrathon and general took l8.5 p.c. Opernting taxes and Ilconcer were up from 8545,785 to $\$ 647,829$.

The total ealary and wage bill for the industry was $\$ 8,553,583$ compared with $\$ 8,115,897$ one year earlier. Baploymant we fiven to 1,029 salarled employoes, 2,964 rogular wage asmers and a monthly avarage of 144 casunls or part tise helpers - total of 4,157 parsons against 4,416 in 2948 or a reduction of 279 . Average eemings of all classes of eaployeos rose frum $\$ 1,838$ to $\$ 2,063$ or by $12.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The Bbove ere exclusive of withdrawals by owners or entrepremeurs.

While the industry as ahole enjoyed a fais yearis operations, the volume of busineas averaged coneldarably loas than in 1948 in most regions. With the greoter avaliability of living accomodation, the demand was eased for household goode storege space, and the percentage of net occupiable space taken averaged lowar than in l948 and in any ywar back to 1944 . Werchondise storage also daclined from 1948 and averaged about 85.7 p.c. cccupancy in 1849 agsinst nearly 90 p.e. in the preceding year. Cold storage occupancy was likwise much lower at about 62 p.c. for the year whereas in 1948 the average was nearly $74 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. However, cold storage space avallable rose from $15,188,887$ cublc feet in 1948 to $22,526,157$ cuble feet in 1949 and explains the decling in average occupancy,

As shom, declinos were general in all itemescept ealaries. Revemues dropped $\$ 861,385$ rom $\$ 17,817,650$ to $816,956,265$ or by 4.8 p.c., while expenses wero cut only $\$ 241,483$ to $\$ 14,477,066$ or 1.6 p.c., and net incone decreased 466,486 to 11,611, SIt . Fage earners were reduced considerably and the total emiary and wage M11 mas off troe $\$ 7,739,226$ to $\$ 7,354,617$.
